

**TWO B. R. T. WRECK  
WIDOWS SETTLE  
CASES FOR \$65,000**

Surrogate Ketcham Permits  
One to Accept \$50,000 and  
Another \$15,000.

Surrogate Ketcham in Brooklyn to-day signed orders permitting executrices of the estate of two victims of the B. R. T. wreck at Malbone Street on Nov. 1 to make private settlements with the New York Consolidated Railway Company, a subsidiary of the B. R. T.

Mrs. Minnie E. Wood of No. 1912 Avenue H, Brooklyn, executrix of the estate of her husband, Harry W. Wood, settled for \$50,000, and Mrs. Jeannette A. Mussen, executrix of the estate of her husband, Wright S. Mussen, settled for \$15,000. Mrs. Mussen lives at No. 462 Ocean Avenue, Brooklyn.

Mrs. Wood in her petition said her husband was employed as a director of employment by the L. Liggett Company and received a salary of \$11,000 a year.

Mrs. Mussen said her husband was assistant manager of the Liggett warehouses and received a salary of \$50 a week.

Wood and Wright were sitting in the same seat at the time of the accident.

**TWO MEN UNDER ARREST  
SUSPECTED AS SWINDLERS**

Extradition From Philadelphia to  
Be Sought on Worthless  
Check Charge.

With the arrest in Atlantic City of Stephen M. Curran, formerly an insurance agent here, and his brother Charles, detectives say they have the man who swindled a number of Manhattan business firms out of several thousand dollars. The two prisoners are now held by the Philadelphia authorities on a charge there, but it is hoped to extradite them to New York.

At Inspector Gray's office it was said that last November a man who gave his name as J. F. Barclay, No. 692 Locust Street, Philadelphia, telephoned to Harris, Forbes & Co. at No. 58 Williams Street, this city, asking quotations on Fourth Liberty bonds. He said he wanted ten \$100 and five \$50 bonds and

that he would send his brother Charles with a certified check for \$1,250. Later a check was presented, the bonds turned over, and then it was found the check was worthless.


