

PHYSICIANS FAVOR RIGID LAWS TO END DRUG TRAFFIC EVIL

Evening World Revelations Stir Up Alienists and Neurologists.

New York physicians are stirred up to-day over the revelations concerning the drug traffic in this city, as testified in the Essex Market Court and published yesterday in The Evening World.

The evidence showed that certain doctors were competing for drug customers, and that Dr. Louis A. Falk, No. 331 Grand Street, wrote over sixty prescriptions daily for drugs, and charged 25 cents for each.

Several of the leading neurologists and alienists of New York have been interviewed on the subject, and the following statements were given to the Evening World:

Dr. Edward E. Hicks, Kings County, Brooklyn State Insane Hospital and Broad Street Hospital, New York:—The use of drugs is becoming more prevalent. The condition of affairs as related in The Evening World is inexcusable. No reputable physician will prescribe drugs unless it is entirely necessary, and there could not possibly be necessity for prescribing for sixty persons daily. Few physicians have a daily clientele even approaching that figure. The best remedy for the condition would be legislation which would empower the State Medical Society to expel unworthy or dishonest members and would require expulsion in case of conviction by the courts. At present physicians can be punished by the courts for vending drugs, but if they are released there is nothing to prevent a continuance of the practice, except another conviction and jail sentence.

Dr. Marcus B. Heyman, Second Vice President, Medical Society of New York, Superintendent State Hospital, Ward's Island—The only remedy for such a state of affairs is legislation. I shall take the matter up at the next meeting of the State Medical Society. Dr. Sylvester Looney, Kings County Hospital and Alienist in United States Army—I feel that the only remedy for such conditions will come through Federal laws, which shall be nationwide, with parallel legislation in Canada. Every doctor in the country should be required to file his qualifications and be registered accordingly; no doctor should be allowed to prescribe narcotics, excepting in restricted amounts, and then with non-refillable prescriptions. A better plan yet would be to prohibit the prescription of narcotics for drug addicts by private physicians. I think the use of drugs is increasing and there is a fear among members of the profession that Prohibition will cause many alcoholics to become drug addicts.
