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U. S. NAVY OVERSEA FLIGHT HAS TO BE PUT OFF TO MAY 1

But One Seaplane Ready for Start Scheduled To-Morrow—Postponement Necessary.

With only one seaplane in readiness to attempt the transatlantic flight originally scheduled to start from the Naval Air Station at Rockaway Point to-morrow, the United States Navy has been obliged to postpone the flight until May 1.

Numerous setbacks have been encountered. The accident which recently befell the NC-1, when the storm of a few days ago destroyed the wings, &c., have caused her complete dismantlement. The NC-2, the only one actually in service, is still undergoing experiments with various kinds of propellers. The NC-3 is nearing completion in its hangar, but will not be ready for flight for at least ten days. The NC-4 has not yet arrived at the Rockaway Point Naval Air Station from the Curtiss works, and when it

does three weeks will be needed to put it in condition.
 In a trial flight yesterday the NC-2, with a load of 28,000 pounds, including seven men as its crew, rose from the water in less than 25 seconds. The NC-2 is considered by experts to be the greatest seaplane in existence, and with its four Liberty motors propelling two tractors forward and two pushers aft, together with the tremendous breadth of its wings and its triple rudder system, will undoubtedly be the most successful in crossing the ocean.
 The course which has been decided upon will be by way of the Azores. It will be mapped out in accordance with reports of the various winds which will be encountered. The Naval Air Station in the Azores is making preparations for the reception of the seaplanes in case of accident or necessary stop-over.
 Each machine will have a total of 1,900 horse-power, and will be fitted with a new form of propeller recently invented by a prominent scientist. These propellers are of great width, extending from the center, outward, thereby permitting a firmer grip on the air, and taking up what was previously lost in motion in other models.
 The NC-2, in her test flights, carried Franklin D. Roosevelt, Assistant Secretary of the Navy, who visited Rockaway Aviation Field to see for himself how preparations are progressing.
 "I enjoyed the short flight very much," said Mr. Roosevelt.
 Asked whether the navy flight would be from Newfoundland direct to the Irish or British coast, or via the Azores route, Mr. Roosevelt replied: "The point has not been settled. It probably will not be until the flying boats reach Newfoundland, when weather conditions and other circumstances will determine the route to be followed."



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
