

BABIES ARE TOSSED INTO NETS AT FIRE THAT KILLS EIGHT

Many More Missing After Apartment House Blaze in Columbus, O.

COLUMBUS, O., May 6.—Eight known dead, with possibility that the number will reach ten or twelve, and a dozen injured, some so badly they cannot live, is the toll of a fire in an apartment building at Broad and Front Streets, centre of the downtown district, here early to-day.

LORD HERSTALPHEND, SHE DOES NOT WANT DESPITE LANDLORD

Pathetic Case of "Dear Old Lady" Cited in Evening World Rent Letters.

The Evening World's request for information concerning rent profiteering is bringing responses from others than tenants. One woman, a social worker, whose own means are too slender to allow her to extend financial aid, but whose heart goes out to the poor and oppressed, has devoted much time to visiting tenants and reporting the most exasperating cases of landlord exploitation to The Evening World.

"I was asked to call on a little old woman in a tenement house on East 75th Street where the rent has been raised from \$9 a month to \$10.50 in the last month. The dear old woman, a lone widow, has lived there more than a year. Her entire income consists of \$2.50 a week from her daughter and \$2 a week from her church. I learned that the daughter has made many sacrifices herself to keep up these small payments to her mother.

"Until four years ago the old lady, who is in her seventy-fifth year, was able to assist in her own support by sewing, but since that time she has suffered from bodily ills that she could do nothing toward earning money. She manages to keep her own three little rooms fairly clean, but they stand sadly in need of paint, which would help to keep down the vermin now overrunning the whole place. Although the halls are dreadfully dirty and the plumbing in some of the apartments so faulty that there is no water at all in the toilets, the only means of flushing them being by carrying water from the kitchens in pails.

"All the tenants whom I saw were afraid to give their names, lest they be supposed as complainers. The little old woman whom I had gone there especially to see made the most pathetic picture I have ever witnessed. She told me that three or four of the other tenants of the house were very kind to her, giving her food now and then from their own scanty stores in the sweet simplicity of her faith she turned to one of Christ on her wall and said: 'The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want.' 'I cannot put upon paper more than a suggestion of the pathos of it, but I left the place in tears, and I believe the landlord would have relented if he had seen the old lady, the beautiful patience of this old lady, God bless The Evening World, I say, for the good work it is doing through making known the acts of these greedy profiteers.

HE'S AFRAID TO SIGN HIS COMPLAINT.

A Bronx tenant writes: "For Heaven's sake don't let my name get to my landlord. He would dispossess me at once, and I have looked everywhere for another apartment without finding one. But I think you ought to know how we have been treated. On April 17, at 9 o'clock in the evening, the janitor of our apartment house delivered to each tenant a typed circular dated April 10 informing us that our May rent would be increased \$3, and that if we did not notify the landlord of our acceptance of the apartments at the raised figure before April 29 he would let them to other tenants on that day. Every tenant in the building works for a living all day, so we virtually had only two evenings in which to look for other quarters. The landlord no doubt knew we could not find places in that time and took this means of forcing us to accept the increase in rent, which we had to do.

"This landlord, still an alien, formerly lived in Russia, where, according to his own oft-told story, he was drafted into the army. It was this that sent him to America, 'the land of the free,' as he has frequently called it, and here he found opportunity to make more money than, by his own confession, he could ever have made there. How he is using that opportunity is revealed in what he is doing to the Americans who chance now to be his tenants.

Another Bronx tenant writes: "Our building, which is one of the old type of railroad flats, has changed hands three times in the last year, and with each change has come an increase in rents, the total advance being \$7 a month. The latest boost was announced in a miscellaneous letter, which stated that the increase was necessary on account of the increased cost of coal, repair supplies, labor, &c. In fact, no coal had been used in the building for weeks before this notice was sent to the tenants; no repair supplies could have been needed, for no repairs have been made in any part of the house; and as for labor, the only work that has been done about the place was that of a janitor who is paid considerably less than the one he had a year ago. As a result of the neglect by these successive owners, who have no interest in the building except to exploit the tenants and sell out to some other tenant, the property has now come down to a deplorable condition, unfit for human habitation, yet here we must stay because we cannot find any place to which to move."

NEW EMPIRE IN ARCTIC URGED UPON CANADA

Stefansson Tells Parliament Reindeer and Musk Ox Herds Would Help Feed Country.

OTTAWA, May 6.—A plan for converting the Arctic and sub-Arctic regions of Canada into a great wool, milk and meat producing area was presented to the Canadian Senate and House of Commons to-day by Vilhjalmur Stefansson, Norwegian explorer of the Canadian Arctic.

Mr. Stefansson's project involves introducing large herds of reindeer and domesticating and developing great herds of musk ox. Both animals would furnish milk and meat supplies, and the musk ox would afford also a wool supply.

The Canadian north, Mr. Stefansson said, could be used to help solve present and future food shortages, and development of his project would expedite opening of mineral and other resources of the north. He estimated there were from 1,000,000 to 2,000,000 square miles of land available for grazing in a climate too severe for cattle but where reindeer and musk ox could exist the year round.
