## TAXI CONTROL BY POLICE AS CHECK UPON DISHONEST AND UNFIT DRIVERS URGED

### Powers of Present Bureau Inadequate to Enforce Law.

By Sophie Irene Loeb. A movement is on foot to put the Taxicab Bureau under the Police Department, as advocated by The Evening World. It is stated that over 100 licenses have been granted to ex-convicts and men of ill repute.

The move is endorsed by all reputable chauffeurs as well as taxicab owners. There have been so many hold-ups and violations of the taxicab ordinance as to warrant such a move. Every policeman should be a traffic policeman. This was urged at the last meeting of the Traffic Committee, of which Dr. John A. Harris, Commissioner of Traffic, is Chairman. As stated in these columns, the leading taxicab companies of this city are forced to change their method of conducting the taxicab business in view of the critical situation regarding chauffeurs. The present ordinance was fought for and secured by The Evening World, and was designed to provide a strict regulation system, reduce the rates and create a wider use for the

vehicle. The beneficial results trained cannot be estimated. PROVISIONS OF THE LAW REGARDED. As prophesied by this newspaper after the ordinance went into effect a complete new system of taxicab service resulted. Prices are the lowest of any city in the country and the number of vehicles have run up to the thousands since the ordinance was passed; but the licensing and regulation of chauffeurs, which was fully provided for in the ordinance, have been disregarded and the ordinance mentioned of putting the whole thing under the Police Department is necessary on account of this neglect.

When Mayor Gaynor appointed a commission, of which I was a member, to draft the ordinance, it was recommended by The Evening World that inspectors with full police power be appointed to insure a complete policing system in the interest of taxicab service. Mayor Gaynor approved and forty inspectors were sworn in as special taxicab policemen, but gradually these have been eliminated and the policemen, as a general proposition, have had little corrective influence over the taxicab service. Violators have gone unpunished as with a light sentence. This is largely due to the fact that the former police power delegated to the Taxicab Bureau has been gradually diminished and the Police Department has paid little attention to the taxicab service. The best taxicab system, in connection with chauffeurs, is generally accredited to London and Paris, where every public vehicle is under the strict surveillance of the police in a sub-department of the Police Department. For the many violations of the taxicab ordinance in this city the public has suffered by paying unnecessary rates and otherwise being inconvenienced.

**Robbers Caught Loading \$5,000 Loot on Truck**
