PUBLIC ENTITLED TO 5C. CONEY FARE, SAYS RIEGELMANN

Borough President Declares B. R. T. Contracts Call for Reduction.

Borough President Riegelmann of Brooklyn has joined the ranks of public officials and lawyers who believe that the Brooklyn Rapid Transit Co. is cheating the public by charging an extra fare between Manhattan and Coney Island over the city-owned West End Line. Mr. Riegelmann's opinion carries weight, for he is experienced in public utility affairs by reason of his former connection with the Public Service Commission in the capacity of associate counsel.

"I have made a cursory examination of the dual system contracts," said Mr. Riegelmann to-day, "and from my reading of them and knowledge gained through my connection with the Public Service Commission I am of the impression that if the sections relating to the five cent fare were properly construed it would be discovered that the public is entitled to a ride to Coney Island for a single five cent fare.

"The sections bearing upon this question are rather ambiguous, but I believe that, without straining the language at all, the above conclusion would be reached.

"One of the principal considerations which led to the signing of the dual system contracts by the city was the promise that when the roads were completed the public would be entitled to the five cent fare to Coney Island. At that time there was every expectation that the roads would be completed and under operation long before this.

"Without intending to say the construction has been deliberately delayed, certainly there has been more than sufficient time to complete this work."

Public Service Commissioner Nixon is not yet ready to give his construction of the five-cent fare section of the contracts. His counsel has not submitted an opinion. Lawyers employed by the B. R. T. have sent or are about to send to counsel for the Public Service Commission arguments contending that the five-cent fare shall not go into operation until the Culver Line is completed and in operation, which will not be before the close of this year.

Under the reading of the five-cent fare clause the B. R. T. would be entitled to another summer of double fares at a cost to the public of approximately \$1,000,000.

500,000 ON 'SILENT STRIKE' IN PROTEST AT POGROMS

Jews Quit Work for Half a Day Over Persecution of Race in the Near East.

It is estimated that 500,000 Jews went on a "silent strike" for half a day at noon to-day in protest against pogroms in Poland, Lithuania, Roumania and other countries of the Near East. Members of the Committee for the Protection of Jews in Poland declare members of their race have been made the victims of organized campaigns of persecution, murder and robbery.

The strike was a preliminary to a parade of 10,000 Jewish soldiers and sailors, marching to the mournful measure of dirges and wearing mourning bands on their arms. Many among them were wounded veterans of the great war, for whom automobiles were provided.

The line of march announced by the committee was from Rutgers Square, through the east side streets to 14th, Fourth, 23rd, Fifth Avenue, 42nd

Street, down Madison Avenue to the square. There it was planned to disband the parade and have 2,000 of the marchers act as ushers at a mass meeting in Madison Square (garden to-night) to voice the protest of prominent speakers against the outrages Jews have suffered.

LADY ARTHUR PAGET DIES IN PARIS OF INFLUENZA

Daughter of Paran Stevens of New York and Boston Was Active in War Work.

News of the death of Lady Arthur Paget, daughter of Paran Stevens of Boston and New York, was received from Paris to-day. She was a victim

of pneumonia and influenza. The wife of Gen. Sir Arthur H. Paget had been a notable figure in the social life of London for many years. Her husband was British Minister to Serbia prior to 1911. She had always done notable service in war emergencies in the Balkans and in the Boer War, and when the late war began, organized the Red Cross hospital service in Serbia. Miss Stevens married Sir Arthur Paget in 1878. She leaves two sons and a daughter. Gen. Paget was Military Commander of Ireland from 1911 to 1917.




