FORD'S \$5 A DAY WAS A GIFT, IS TESTIFIED

Office Manager Says Sum Is Not Profit Sharing and Company Can Withhold It.

MOUNT CLEMENS, Mich., June 3.—E. F. Clemett, office manager for the Ford Motor Company, who was in the educational department of the company in 1916 when the Tribune published the alleged libellous editorial headed "Ford is an Anarchist," was again on the witness stand today.

Weymouth Kirkland, of counsel for the Tribune, spent some time with the witness developing the fact that if \$5 a day men went to the Mexican border as soldiers and new men were taken in their places at \$12.25 a day, the Ford company would save \$2.25 a day per man until the newcomers attained the \$5 rate or the soldiers returned.

Attorney William Van Dyke, representing the Solomon News Company, co-defendants, asked: "After an employee has worked through the probationary period of six months at \$12.25 a day and then is given \$5 a day, do you regard the additional \$2.25 as a share of the profits which he has earned by his industry and efficiency?" asked Mr. Van Dyke. "No," answered the witness. "It is a gift. The company has the right to withhold it."

Afghan Fighting in End, India's Victory Reported.

LONDON, June 3.—The Viceroy of India reports that the Ameer of Peshawar, British India, has expressed a desire for peace with the British in the region of Khyber Pass, where recently there has been considerable fighting between Afghan tribesmen,

revolutionary Indians and the British forces. The Ameer, according to the report, says he has instructed the Afghan commanders to cease hostilities.


