


**TROLLEY RUNS INTO HOUSE.**


Two in Building and Six on Car Hurt in Cohoes Accident.

**CAFFEY SAYS U. S. COURT CAN'T UPHOLD BREWERS**

**Denies Authority to Issue Injunction Restraining Him From Enforcing Beer Law.**  
United States District Attorney Francis G. Caffey, who is a defendant with Deputy Collector of Internal Revenue Richard J. McMillott, in the suit in equity brought by the Jacob Hoffman Brewing Company, has defined his position in his answer just filed in the United States District Court.  
The brewing company had asked the
