

Cholera Epidemic at Poochow.
 WASHINGTON, July 9.—An epidemic of cholera has broken out at Poochow, China, according to a cable despatch to the State Department to-day from the American Consul there.

COUNCIL OF FIVE HALTS BELA KUN'S FINANCIAL SCHEME

Warns Him Not to Proceed With His Proposed Sale of Securities.

PARIS, July 9.—The Council of Five, having been advised that Bela Kun, the head of the Hungarian Communist Government, proposes to sell a large amount of securities, has under consideration a note to him disapproving his plan. If it sends a note to Bela Kun the Council also will probably send a note to all nations advising their nationals not to purchase the securities offered by the Hungarians.

The Council, it is said, feels that it is to the best interest of the Allies and Hungary that the securities be kept within Hungary.

Transportation difficulties have resulted in a further delay of the German plenipotentiaries designed to come to Versailles for the oral discussions regarding execution of the reparations and other features of the Peace Treaty which the Allied powers recently signified their willingness to enter into.

It developed to-day that the Germans would not reach Versailles in time to begin the negotiations tomorrow, as had been expected.

The Chamber of Deputies yesterday rejected a bill providing for the immediate raising of the state of siege

and the suppression of the censorship, the vote being 58 to 202. The Government, represented by Stephen Pichon, the Foreign Minister, opposed the measure.

The Socialists and the Republican Socialists demanded the immediate suppression of both the state of siege and the censorship, but M. Pichon declared that this step was impossible before the Treaty of Peace becomes effective through its ratification by three or more Powers.

The debate closed with a categorical statement by the Government raising the question of confidence on the rejection of the bill. The Chamber became greatly agitated during the discussion, the Socialists and the Radicals becoming particularly aroused. Victor Dalbiez, Deputy from the Eastern Pyrennees, read a recent resolution adopted by the Executive Committee of the Radical Party calling for an immediate return to peace conditions. Many of the Radicals refused to follow their party on this question and voted with the Government.

It was remarked in the lobbies after the vote that this was the second time the Government's majority had been reduced to hardly more than fifty, the smallest margin on which any government had continued in power since the beginning of the war.

Premier Asquith at Coblenz.
 COBLENZ, Tuesday, July 8 (By the Associated Press).—Herbert H. Asquith, former British Premier, who has been visiting the British occupied area, arrived here to-day and was a dinner guest of Major-General Henry T. Allen, the new commander of the American forces in Germany. Mr. Asquith plans to spend several days in the Coblenz bridgehead district.

PLAN TO TRY EX-KAISER CAUSES MANY SUICIDES

Prussian Officers and Wives See Loss of Social Prestige So "End It All."

GENEVA, July 9.—Both German officers and their wives, especially in Prussia, are committing suicide with alarming frequency since it became known the former Emperor is to be tried by the Allies. It is attributed both to patriot-

ism and the loss of the officers' former social position.

In Prussia suicides among the officers is 25 per cent. more than before announcement of the former Kaiser's trial.

MARTIAL LAW AT HANOVER.

Several Persons Killed and Wounded in the Fighting There.

BERLIN, July 6 (via London).—Several persons were killed and wounded when a mob released the prisoners in the castle and the detention prisoners. Martial law has been proclaimed there.



