

CARDINAL MERCIER GIVES BLESSING TO BALTIMORE CROWD

Has First Rest in America as the Guest of Cardinal Gibbons.

BALTIMORE, Sept. 11.—A day without ceremony has been arranged for Cardinal Mercier, Primate of Belgium, who is the guest of Cardinal Gibbons here.

To-day's only affair is a visit to the home of Wilbur Miller in Worthington Valley. To-morrow he makes his first public appearance in Baltimore, when he will address the priests of the Archdiocese of Baltimore, now in retreat at St. Mary's Sulpician Seminary. Saturday he plans to rest. Sunday, however, will be one of endeavor, for he will pontificate at a solemn mass in the Cathedral.

Monday is planned his public reception to the people of the city, whom he will greet them at the 5th Regiment Armory. Tuesday he will deliver his official message to America. He goes back to New York Wednesday.

A picturesque spectacle was presented as Cardinal Mercier and Cardinal Gibbons of Baltimore greeted each other fervently upon the Belgian's arrival here.

"Fax tecum," said Cardinal Mercier softly as he embraced Cardinal Gibbons and bestowed the ecclesiastical salute—a kiss on either cheek. His message of "Pence be with thee" was answered by Cardinal Gibbons in the Latin tongue, "And with thy spirit."

There was an enthusiastic demonstration in front of Cardinal Gibbons' residence. Both prelates showed the greatest patience and fortitude in dealing with the enthusiastic crowd. They stood for several minutes on the steps of the residence while they were being photographed, and when some one tugged at the

arm of Cardinal Mercier to pilot him into the house before the photographers had completed their work, he smilingly pushed him aside, saying, "Oh, wait just a minute, they have been so kind and patient."
At this juncture the crowd began surging around to get a glimpse of the Belgian prelate. Then it was that Cardinal Gibbons made the first move toward ascending the front steps. Upon reaching the very top step both Cardinals halted, when Mercier raised his tall frame to its extreme height and gave his blessing to the crowd. Immediately Cardinal Gibbons proposed three cheers, and they were given with a will.

ALLEGED HOLD-UP MEN HELP UP BY POLICEMAN

O'Hara Gets Report of Robbery Over Phone, Turns Around and Captures Three Youths.

When three young men were arrested to-day in the Tombs Police Court, charged with a midnight robbery and assault in which a man of fifty-five was the victim, the story was told of how Policeman O'Hara held up the alleged hold-up men.

Frank Roe, a sailor of No. 25 South Street, was found shortly after midnight lying in the gutter at the corner of South Street and Coenties Slip. To Patrolman Pfling of the Old Slip Station he told a story of having been set upon by three young men who beat him with brass knuckles and stole his watch and \$21.

Roe was hurried to Broad Street Hospital, where his wounds were dressed by Dr. Goodfellow.

O'Hara, standing at the corner of Moore and Water Streets, one block from Coenties Slip, had just banged the signal box after hearing of the hold-up when three young men who fitted the description of the hold-up men came along. O'Hara drew his gun and made one job of the arrest.

The accused describe themselves as Charles Snyder, twenty-one, a laborer of No. 627 15th Street, Brooklyn; John Miller, twenty-two, laborer, No. 20 Malavia Street, Manhattan, and John McGraw, eighteen, mess-boy of 3612 Mount Vernon Street, Philadelphia.

Miller, the police say, carried brass knuckles in one of McGraw's pockets three blood-stained one dollar bills were found.
