

4 MISSING FROM FISH-LADEN BOAT AS GAS EXPLODES

Eight Other Persons Escape Flames by Leaping Into the Bay.

Four members of the crew of the 70-ton auxiliary schooner Gleaner are missing, and the Captain, mate and six of the crew are in the Marine Hospital, Staten Island, with injuries and burns because of an explosion that occurred on the boat last evening about 200 feet off Bay Ridge Avenue, Brooklyn.

The schooner, which had come from New Bedford, Mass., with a cargo of fish which it unloaded at Fulton Market, was taking on a cargo of gasoline from a Standard Oil lighter anchored in the bay. Half an hour after she began to load, persons on shore heard an explosion and saw the schooner burst into flames, through which were hurled the forms of four men, who probably were drowned.

Sailors from the Bay Ridge Naval Barracks put out in half a dozen small launches, and rescued the rest of the crew, who had been forced to leap overboard after fighting the flames two or three minutes. The sailors scoured until dark, but could not find any trace of the four blown

overboard. Two police boats arrived after the schooner had burned to the water's edge and sunk. The lighter was undamaged. The four missing men are Frederick Richards, Muse Iliad, Moses Sureppe and Henry Merchant. The survivors were the Captain, Louis Donchette; the mate, Eugene La Blanc, and Matthew Richards, Albert Porter, Alton Malley, Albert Hembitz, Fred Surade and William Babine. Donchette has a broken arm and bad burns about the body. With the exception of Donchette, who comes from Edgartown, Mass., all the men lived at New Bedford.

MEAT SHORTAGE FELT.

Butchers' Strike Affects Delicatessen Stores.

Delicatessen stores, especially in Brooklyn, were unable to get their usual supply of meats on account of the butchers' strike. Some of the smaller meat shops were also feeling the pinch of the strike and many were limiting the amount of meat they would sell to a customer.

Neither master butchers nor striking employees showed any disposition to yield to the positions they had taken.

HIGH PRICE OF CLOTHING LAID TO THE AMALGAMATED

Employers Forced by Union to Pay \$500,000 in Fines, Assists Prosecutor.

CINCINNATI, Nov. 7.—Present high prices for men's ready-made clothing today were blamed on the Amalgamated Clothing Workers of America, by Nicholas Michela, Assistant State's Attorney, in whose hands were books and records of the organization taken in a raid yesterday on its headquarters. More than \$500,000 in "fines" and "settlements" was taken from clothing manufacturers by the union, the State's attorney's office charged. Agents called strikes for their own gain. It also is alleged.

The organization is said to have more than 150,000 members dominating the clothing industry at Chicago, New York and Rochester, N. Y. Various small factories and shops were driven out of business and the entire industry was compelled to pay tribute, according to Mr. Michela.

New Brazilian Envoy Approved. RIO JANEIRO, Thursday, Nov. 6.—Augusto Cochrane De Almeida, who has accepted the invitation to become Brazilian Ambassador to the United States, will sail within a month, going by way of London. The Brazilian Government has received assurances that General De Almeida is acceptable to the United States.
