

ANONYMOUS GIFT OF \$25,000 BOOSTS RED CROSS FUND

Sale of Christmas Seals in Greater City Goes On With Increased Activity.

A donor who requested that his name be withheld has sent a check for \$25,000 to campaign headquarters for Red Cross Christmas Seals, No. 145 West 47th Street, bringing the total for Manhattan up to \$60,000.

It is said that the sales of seals have been particularly heavy in Brooklyn and Queens, but figures from none of the boroughs save Manhattan have been tabulated.

Many society women have been appearing in the Santa Claus booths throughout the city. Forewarned by the experience of Mrs. Albert L. Sterns, who, with several others, was driven off Fifth Avenue on the opening day of the campaign, all carried "peddler's permits."

Poor children of the east side who have been exposed to tuberculosis but are being given a chance for life at the city clinics, actively joined the seal selling army.

Reports from out of the city indicate the drive is going even better than in New York. Marshall County, S. D., was the first to report itself "over the top."

New York, having the largest tuberculosis death list in the country, naturally has the hardest task ahead in the campaign, but it is confidently predicted the goal will be more than reached.

Health Commissioner Copeland again called on New Yorkers to get behind the campaign. "Don't put off buying the seal," he urged. "Get them at the first booth, or send at once to the headquarters. This is a cause that must not lag."

The Commissioner brought generous supply for his personal use. The campaign lasts ten days, and the committee, of which George Gordon Battle is chairman, hopes to sell stamps or health bonds to every person in New York before it is ended.

LATEST CASUALTY FIGURES.

Over 90 Per Cent. of All War Deaths in Army Due to Disease.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 3.—Figures compiled by the Statistics Bureau, General Staff, up to Nov. 29, account for 117,151 deaths in the American Army in Europe, Siberia and the United States. Deaths in Europe aggregated 10,318, including 2,844 marines, while deaths in the United States totaled 26,833.

The latest figures place the number of killed in action in Europe at 26,070; died of wounds received in action, 14,922; died of disease, 24,992; died of accident and other causes, 8,118. The deaths in the United States include 24,779 from disease and 2,059 from accident and other causes.

A casualty list to-day included the following killed in action: Sergt. Frederick G. Knats, No. 301 East 81st Street, New York City, and Corp. Mitchell Harton, Victory Mills, N. Y.






