

FAIRSERVIS IS COLONEL OF BROOKLYN'S 23D REGT. BY SMITH'S APPOINTMENT

Wall Street Man's Rise in Military Service Has Been Phenomenal.

Lieut. Col. Thomas Fairservis, who has been a member of the 23d Regiment of Brooklyn for sixteen years, has been appointed Colonel of the Regiment by Gov. Smith. He succeeds Col. Lewis Jewett Prager, who resigned a few days ago. Col. Fairservis is one of the youngest commanding officers in the State, being only thirty-five years old. He is a native of Brooklyn, a graduate of the public schools and of the New York University. He is now a partner in the firm of George H. Gibbons & Co., No. 40 Wall Street. Col. Fairservis began his military career in 1893 when he enlisted in the 23d as a private. Five years afterward he was made Corporal, and since that time his advance has been rapid. He commanded Company C during the Mexican border campaign, and when the regiment was again called into Federal service he was appointed Regimental Adjutant. He was on the Governor's staff during the Whitman Administration.

D. K. E. TO MEET IN HAVANA.

Cuban President to Send Gunboat for Fraternity Members.

The Delta Kappa Epsilon Fraternity yesterday at its meeting at the D. K. E. Club, No. 29 West 44th Street, selected Havana, Cuba, as its next place of meeting. President Menocal of Cuba, who is a member of the Cornell Chapter, extended by cable a cordial invitation and offered a Cuban gunboat for the trip. The invitation was accepted as an indication of the friendly spirit of Latin America toward the United States. This will be the first meeting of an American college fraternity outside of the United States.

Evans Wollen of Yale was elected Undergraduate President of the convention and James Anderson Hawes General Fraternity Secretary. Officers of the general fraternity were elected as follows: President, Ogden Mills Reid; Vice President, J. K. Ohi; Secretary and Treasurer, James A. Hawes. At the afternoon session John Clair Minot, editor of the Boston Herald, read an original poem, "The Building of the Temple," commemorative of D. K. E.'s seventy-five years of good work. Last night the delegates occupied the entire Princess Theatre.
