\$3,000,000 ASKED FOR FOUR NEW AIR ROUTES ACROSS U.S.

Burlison Plans Mail Service to Link All Cities From Coast to Coast.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9.—Four new aerial mail routes to link the important cities of the country from coast to coast will be established if Congress grants an appropriation of \$3,000,000.

The new routes as outlined by Burlison in a letter to the Congressional Post Office Committee are: Chicago to San Francisco, thus giving aerial mail service from New York to the Pacific coast.

New York to Atlanta, by an extension from Washington. Minneapolis and St. Paul to St. Louis via Chicago.

A fifth route being investigated is by hydroplane down the Mississippi River from St. Louis to New Orleans with stops at Cairo, Memphis and Vicksburg.

The new routes would reduce nearly one half the mail time between the cities.
