

### VICTORY CLAIMED BY BOTH SIDES IN ELEVATOR STRIKE

Many of the Men Who Went Out Reported to Be Back in Old Jobs.

As the elevators in the big office and apartment buildings go up and up the strike controversy over them seems to be going down and down. There was, however, to-day a diversity of opinion as to what was so clearing the situation. The leaders of the strike said that more than 300 of the big buildings in the city had capitulated to the extent of meeting the demands of the union, and the superintendents of the buildings said that they were doing very well, thank you, with the hundreds of non-union men who had applied for jobs and received them and were running the elevators—in fact, much better than they had ever been run before.

In some cases there was decided difference between the statements of the strike leaders and those in charge of the buildings in question. This was especially true in the case of the Woodworth and Equitable Buildings.

In the former case the strike managers said that the owners had capitulated, although the starter in the building declared that no such thing

had occurred. He added that thirty-two young women and three men were conducting the elevator service with great satisfaction to every one.

So far as the Equitable is concerned, the Superintendent said that no agreement has been made, but that three of the strikers came back for their old jobs to-day and those of the others will be held open until the end of the week in case they want to return. If they do this they will not lose their good standing. The Equitable, it was said, is paying the wage demanded by the union.

At strike headquarters it was announced that to-day the buildings in mid-city were expected to declare their readiness to accept the union's demands.

### SHIPS CAUSE OIL SHORTAGE.

Standard Official Sees Higher Prices for Gas Companies' Supply.

The tremendous demand for fuel oil for ships, is the cause of the present oil shortage, according to Herbert L. Pratt, Vice President of the Standard Oil Company, who was the principal witness to-day before the Public Service Commission in the inquiry into the oil situation as it affects gas making corporations. He declared reserve oil supplies have been cut down and there has been a falling off in production.

As a business proposition, Mr. Pratt added, gas oil will have to sell at twelve cent a gallon, otherwise it will be more profitable to get every bit of gasoline out of the gas oil, thereby reducing materially the quantity of the latter.






