

**MORE DETECTIVES
THAN GAMBLERS AT
THE POLO GROUNDS**

Evening World's Publicity
Causes a Clean-Up That
Will Benefit Baseball.

Private and public police outnumbered the betting fraternity at the baseball game at the Polo Grounds yesterday, and consequently there were no visible manifestations of betting. At every entrance to the grounds city detectives as well as scouts employed by the baseball management were stationed. When the crowds began to arrive those known to be habitual bettors were denied admittance to the grounds. Inside, along the lengthy gangways to the benches, other detectives listened intently for a stray word or two about betting, and without waiting for any consummation of the wager the principals were escorted to the gate, where their money was refunded and they were told to go and keep quiet.

About third base in the grand stand every suspected gambler—or one possessing the earmarks of a gentleman likely to engage in a game of chance—was "covered" in the police vernacular, by the detectives. As a result of this vigilance nothing was said about betting, no wagers were made, and no money was passed. The detectives were as thick as flies in August. There was one detail of men from the special service squad under Capt. Belton at Police Headquarters.

Two "box fighters" of note from the vicinity of 114th Street moved about the stand once or twice, with the result they were told to sit in one place or get out. An argument ensued, in which Detective McNamee from Inspector Cahalan's office and Detective Michael Kelly of Chief Inspector Daly's staff ousted the "box fighters" and insisted that they keep to their seats, which they did, flanked on the sides and rear by detectives. Unintended praise of The Evening World's exposure of the gamblers on baseball was heard throughout the Bronx Stadium during the afternoon.


