

PALMER TO START ANOTHER HUNT FOR COAL PROFITEERS

Big Operators Expected to "Pass the Buck" to the Independents.

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 27.—The Department of Justice is preparing to start on another of its periodical profiteer hunts. The conference between Attorney General Palmer and the coal operators in New York today is expected to be devoted largely to a discussion of operators' profits. It is suspected that the big mine operators will "pass the buck" to the small independent mine owners, whom they blame for certain inequitable conditions in the trade and also for luring the miners from the larger mines with promises of big wage increases.

It is understood the miners may later take a hand in the discussion between the Government and the operators as to the causes for ex-

orbitant coal prices. The operators are blaming it on low production as well as transportation, but miners' representatives claim that the miners are holding up their end and have been getting out coal at a rate that will compare favorably with former years. Attention is called to the bituminous coal production of 10,000,000 tons for the week ending July 27, just announced by the Geological Survey, which was the largest of any week since the first of the railroad switchmen's strike in March. This output also exceeded that of the last previous full time week by 413,000 tons.

The outcome of the conference between the Department of Justice and the operators is expected to be an understanding regarding a limitation of profits. What the probable scale of prices will be is not yet known. It is said by some of the operators that the independent or "wagon mines" are offering as high as \$2 a ton over the scale for labor and this is exerting an unstabilizing influence on the situation. Some of the larger operators are said to be favorably inclined to the price-fixing plan in order to check the independent operators who are charged with doing the bulk of the profiteering.

Repeated warnings of an impending Nation-wide coal shortage are discounted by many persons in close touch with the situation. The Northwest section, which is behind in storage of coal for the winter months, and New England appear to be the two sections of the country that have

a legitimate protest coming at this time. Statistics for the first six months of 1920 show a tonnage of 254,987,000 or 47.22 per cent. of the estimated requirements for the year, 540,000,000 tons. It is difficult for many experts to see why there should be anything approaching a Nation-wide coal shortage barring a complete breakdown of transportation.






