

LIGHTNING FLASH MAY HAVE CAUSED DEATH OF 7 IN AUTO

Dr. McGuire Believed to Have Been Confused as Car Dashed to Doom.

Many parts of the Bronx to-day paid tribute to the memory of the seven persons killed when Dr. George H. McGuire's six-cylinder touring car plunged over a twenty-five-foot retaining wall at the foot of Dock Hill, Dobbs Ferry, during the storm yesterday. The only occupant of the car not killed was Francis McGuire, the doctor's twelve-year-old son, who was thrown clear of the wreck and is in the Dobbs Ferry Hospital with a broken thigh.

The victims all lived in the Bronx and were highly respected, especially in the parish of the Church of Our Lady of Mercy, Marlon Avenue and Fordham Road, where the family were communicants of long standing.

George McGuire Jr., a Fordham University student, had been in a summer school at Orange Lake near Newburgh. Young Mulrooney, also a Fordham student, was his chum. Dr. McGuire, his wife and two children, and his brother-in-law, Mr. Howley and wife, went up after George Saturday, and took Mulrooney alone. They were returning when the accident occurred.

STORM BLAMED FOR THE FATAL PLUNGE.
 Dr. McGuire, who was known as a careful driver, followed the habit of most motorists in approaching New York through Dobbs Ferry from Tarrytown by turning off Broadway, near Ashford Avenue, into the main

street of Dobbs Ferry to avoid the hilly Broadway just beyond. After passing through Main Street to the lower part of the village, Broadway is reached again by keeping to the left past the street to the right, running down Dock Hill toward the depot and lumber yard on the shore of the river.

A thunderstorm was in progress as the car reached Dock Hill, and it is supposed that instead of keeping on to the left the driver of the car, being on the right-hand side of the road, unsuspectingly passed the fork and plunged down the steep hill toward the retaining wall and river. A blinding flash of lightning at the moment may have accounted for it. No one saw the accident. But the crash of the car through the iron railing above the retaining wall beyond the bridge at the foot of the hill where the road turns slightly south was heard by a party of men who had taken refuge under the depot pavilion roof when their car became stalled at the top of the hill.

They were taken to the rooms of P. C. Murphy, No. 343 East Fordham Road, where another large crowd gathered. The bodies will all be taken to the McGuire home to-day and will remain there until Wednesday, when they will be taken to St. Raymond's cemetery. A requiem mass at the Church of Our Lady of Mercy, for the Howleys at 10:30 and for the McGuires at 11. Burial will be in St. Raymond's cemetery.

Dr. George H. McGuire was a native of New York, the son of John McGuire, born in Scotland, and his wife, Mary Harrington, who was born in Ireland. He graduated from City College in 1879, and from the New York University Medical College at the age of twenty-one, and started practice of medicine associated with Dr. Emil Hupfel in the Bronx. For the last thirty years he has practiced alone. His home is one of the prettiest in the Bronx, and his fortune is estimated at \$1,000,000.

He was a member of the Bronx Medical Society and well known throughout the borough. He was a brother-in-law of Dr. Edward T. Higgins, formerly chief surgeon of the New York Police Department. One sister, Mrs. Lillian Hynes of the Bronx, is the only remaining member of his immediate family, except his son Francis. Dr. McGuire's wife was Miss Florence O'Sullivan of the Bronx, to whom he was married in 1903.

John J. Howley, who, with his wife Annie, sister of Dr. McGuire, was killed, was a brother of Dr. William Howley of the Bronx, and was Inspector of Public Buildings and the Building Department. Mr. Howley was a prominent member of the Bronx Elks. Edward Mulrooney Jr., the boy who lost his life, was to have entered the Regis High School to-day.

NOTED DOCTOR HURT AND WIFE KILLED AS TRAIN STRIKES AUTO
 Dr. Joseph S. Spellissy Seriously Injured, Also Second Woman in the Car.
 Mrs. Joseph S. Spellissy, wife of the noted Philadelphia surgeon, is

dead, and her husband may die as the result of a grade crossing accident near Point Pleasant Beach, N. J., yesterday. The automobile in which they were riding with a friend was struck at the Foreman Avenue crossing of the New York and Long Branch Railroad by the Philadelphia-Long Branch Express running out of Camden.

Mrs. Spellissy died in the Ann May Memorial Hospital at Spring Lake Beach. The physician has a broken leg, serious scalp wounds, many lacerations and possibly internal injuries.

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 12.—Dr. Joseph S. Spellissy is one of the most widely known orthopedic surgeons in the country, and one of the greatest bone specialists in the world. He is about fifty-five years old and was graduated from the University of Pennsylvania in 1890.
 Dr. Spellissy has devoted considerable attention to diseases affecting the spine, especially among the crippled children of the poor. Besides being one of the chief members of the Medical Board of St. Joseph's Hospital, he is connected with the University of Pennsylvania Consulting Board, the Case Methodist Hospital, Jefferson Hospital and Orthopedic Hospital and is usually consulted by nearly every

hospital in the city when a delicate orthopedic operation is to be performed.

U. S. S. PITTSBURGH FLOATED

WASHINGTON, Sept. 12.—The American cruiser Pittsburgh has been safely floated and is now in the Harbor of Libau. This information was received by the Navy Department in a despatch from Vice Admiral House on board the Pittsburgh. The extent of the damage to the hull of the ship is not definitely known.
