

HEIR TO MILLIONS OF W. G. BYRNE IS FIGHTING PASTOR

Mixes It With Police When Arrested in His Church for Wayward Girls.

MONTREAL, Sept. 14.—When Rev. David S. K. Byrne, who conducts the Christian Workers' Congregational Mission, first came here he exhibited to various newspapers documents which he said would help him to establish his claim to an inheritance of \$10,000,000 which it is announced has been left him by W. G. Byrne, Chicago millionaire, whose daughter he rescued from the street. He was formerly a salesman and changed his name from Kidd to Byrne at the millionaire's request, he says. Millionaire Byrne and his wife were lost in the sinking of the Empress of Ireland, and the daughter has just died, leaving all to D. S. K. Byrne for evangelical work.

He was absent several years from Montreal and when he bobbed up again he explained he had been to Australia in connection with his fortune. He did not appear to lack for money and he promptly established the mission which he is still conducting, advertising its services liberally. He attained a large following and frequently related the story of his fortune.

When a few weeks ago "Pastor Byrne" was yanked from the pulpit by detectives and conveyed in a black maria to the cells, his congregation was bitterly indignant, and the pastor showed himself so resentful that although he is but a little clergy and lame, two of the most stalwart detectives had a tough time in arresting him and one of them still bears the marks of the pastor's teeth. The arrest was made at the demand of a Toronto bank which thought itself swindled by some of his financial transactions. He was released and resumed his mission work with unabated vigor.




