**VANS PLENTIFUL,
SAY MOVING MEN**

**Declare Drivers Are Being Re-
cruited and Conditions Soon
Will Be Normal.**

Prospects for the settlement of the strike of moving van men before Oct. 1 are exceedingly slight, although the Van Owners' Association said today that there would be plenty of vans by moving day to supply the demand.

Union officials said yesterday that members were being paid their wages out of a union fund and were prepared to continue the strike indefinitely.

According to Charles S. Morris, President of the Van Owners' Association, there are 156 moving vans in operation at present, manned by union men who have returned to work at the \$2 increase offered by the association at the outbreak of the strike. J. J. McKenna, organizer of the Van Teamsters' Union, said that an additional 400 trucks were being operated under the supervision of firms which have agreed to the strikers' demands. He added that owners of 100 more vans

had signified their intention of signing the agreement, and their trucks will be driven by union men by to-night.


