

GUIDE CABLE TEST IN CHANNEL O. K.

Electrical Vibrator Device Alays Perils of Ships in Darkness or Fog.

A successful test by the destroyer Semmes of the channel guide cable from the Amoroze Light into New York Harbor was announced to-day by the Navy Department. The cable laid a year ago, at a cost of \$10,000 several weeks ago will make it possible for ships to use the channel in either direction during the thickest fog or snow. It is charged with a 500 cycle motor power current which acts by induction on receivers attached to the sides of the ship. By the tone of the vibrations carried to the navigator from these receivers he can tell his exact distance from the center of the channel.

Yesterday's test was made by Commander R. F. McConnell, Radio Officer of the New York Naval District, who supervised the installation of the cable. The Semmes, with her pilot house completely blinded by canvas screens, was brought from the Ambrose Lightship to Quarantine with no other guide than the underwater signaling of the new cable.

Canadian Start Flight Across Continent.

HALIFAX, N. S., Oct. 7.—Two officers of the Canadian Royal Air Force started the trans-continental flight to Vancouver this morning at 8 o'clock when they "hopped off" from the Eastern Passage Air Station. They expect to reach Riviere Dulloup on the west leg of their journey.

FOX SHIP LINES PUT IN BANKRUPTCY

Petition Filed Against Concerns Whose Officers Were Indicted for Fraud.

An involuntary bankruptcy petition was filed to-day in the Federal Court against Victor S. Fox & Co., Inc. and thirteen subsidiary shipping companies, all of No. 47 Broadway, by Nield, Anable, Fuller & Sullivan of No. 81 Broadway, on behalf of the Green Paint Works, Inc., the Williams and Wells Company and the John Colby Outfitting Company.

Victor S. Fox, President, and William H. Kaiser, Treasurer of the Fox Corporation, were indicted this week by a Federal Grand Jury, charged with conspiracy to defraud the Government.

The Fox Company is a New York corporation. The subsidiary companies included in to-day's bankruptcy petition, all of which were incorporated in Delaware, are: The Muscota, Tonawanda, Rapahoe, Chillicothe, Monongahela and Masholu Navigation Companies, and the Jeannette, Mt. Shasta, Isomonia, Castlewood, Arsenia, and Conna Steamship Companies and the Consolidated Maritime Lines, Inc.

N. Y. MEN GET WAR HONORS.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7.—New York men who were members of the reserve units serving in an army area during major operations of the expeditionary forces in France and Belgium are entitled to receive "battle clasps."

This decision was announced to-day by the War Department. Heretofore only officers and men who served in the units which participated actively in the fighting have been the recipients.

Organizations composing these reserve divisions will also be entitled to the name of the operation on their battle streamers.
