

BRIDE A FORTNIGHT, WON AT GUN POINT, SUES FOR DIVORCE

Mrs. William J. Hart Says She Was Forced to Wed Against Her Will.

Charging that her husband emulated the gun play of his famous namesake, Mrs. Madeline M. Hart of Arlington, N. J., a bride of a few weeks, has filed an action for annulment of her marriage in the Bronx Supreme Court.

Mrs. Hart is the same woman who, on Jan. 6, held her husband to the Morrisania Court and charged that she had been wooed and won by cave-man methods and she wanted the court to make Hart stop pestering her with his annoying attentions. When the complaint had been withdrawn the husband said to reporters: "I love my wife and she loves me. It is a question of her parents being a disturbing influence."

According to the brief information contained in the papers filed by her attorney, John J. McFride, of No. 25 Broadway, she married William J. Hart of No. 325 Creston Avenue, the Bronx, on Dec. 30, against her will. "He thrust a revolver at me and ordered me into a taxi, rushing me to City Hall," swears the bride in her brief complaint. "All the way down he threatened he would shoot me unless I went through with the whole thing. I was in dread and fear of my life when I answered the questions in the application for the license, and also at the ceremony."

The ceremony, the papers say, was performed at the City Hall by Deputy City Clerk J. R. Dalton.

Hart is not known at No. 325 Creston Avenue, it was said there.
