

### GERMAN ARRESTED, CHARGE VIOLATION OF PASSPORT LAW

Posing as Frenchman, Is Alleged to Have Reached Los Angeles Via Canada.

LOS ANGELES, Calif., March 25.—A man named Duval, the proprietor of a chemical plant here, who is alleged to be a German enemy alien posing as a Frenchman, has been arrested here. The charge is violating the passport laws and regulations in leaving New York, where he was registered. It is alleged he re-entered the United States through Canada and was accompanied here by a German woman not his wife.  
C. E. Cunningham, formerly of Brooklyn and President of a contracting company here, has been arrested on a charge of passing checks

with intent to defraud.

**Alleged Milan Bomber Arrested.**  
LONDON, March 25.—Authorities at Milan announce that the bomb which wrecked the Diana Theatre in that city on Wednesday night, killing thirty-one persons, was placed outside the building by three individuals, says a Milan dispatch to the Central News. One of the guilty persons is declared by carabinieri in that city to have been arrested and it was found that the skin had been burned off his hands by the explosion.

**TWO WOMEN OVERCOME.**  
Jersey City Fire Also Drives Out Thirty Families.

Mrs. Mary Lopez and Mrs. William Bender were overcome during a fire in their homes, Nos. 972 and 974 Garfield Avenue, Jersey City, early to-day. They were rescued by Detective Daniel King and Patrolman Duncan Brown, who carried them from the burning houses.

The fire started from an unknown cause in a barber shop and pool room at No. 279 Garfield Avenue, conducted by Louis Morales, and spread to the adjoining frame cottages. The loss is estimated at about \$5,000. Thirty families were driven out and several firemen overcome.



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
