

VOLSTEAD VICTIMS TO MARCH AS BODY IN ANTI-DRY PARADE

Yorkville to Contribute Contingent of 25,000—Drive for Surplus Fund.

The official drive for funds to help defray the large expense of the Anti-Prohibitionist parade will start tomorrow, and the public is again warned to pay no money to any one professing to be connected with the committee, unless such person can show an identification card bearing his or her name and photograph, together with a printed and numbered subscription blank bearing the same name and the official stamp of the Anti-Prohibitionist Parade Committee.

This drive is necessitated by the fact that the committee is not receiving money from the liquor, hotel or restaurant people, and must depend to large extent upon small individual donations.

While we have a fair working balance in the Corn Exchange Bank, said F. C. Drake, Director General of the parade, "we shall need a great deal more for music, flags, floats and the salaries of stenographers and clerks at headquarters."

Mr. Drake added that within a few days, probably by Saturday, the committee's headquarters at No. 1233 Broadway will be thrown open to all citizens who wish to enroll in the national organization now forming in every State to fight openly for repeal of the Volstead law. The rooms would have been available for this purpose some days since if it had been possible to get the necessary blanks printed and to secure sufficient furniture and a corps of experienced clerks on such short notice. For it should be remembered that this movement is but ten days old.

A feature of the parade will be a division of private citizens who have been subjected to arrest, search and seizure and exonerated in court. They will carry a banner inscribed: "We Are Volstead Criminals." There will also be a large colored contingent with its own band of jazz players.

TRIES TWICE TO DIE IN LEAP FROM BOAT

Ferry Deckhand Stops Rudeiker First Time—Rescued From Water on Second Attempt.

Paul Rudeiker, forty-one, whose address is unknown, is under observation at the New York City Farm Colony, at New Springville, S. I. Twice within twelve hours he attempted to commit suicide from the Staten Island ferryboat Richmond, and twice his attempt was frustrated by a deck hand. The second time he succeeded in leaping from the ferry and Joseph Gaffney went after him.

It was at 4:30 o'clock this morning when Rudeiker jumped the second time from the boat. Gaffney leaped into the bay with his clothes on. It was five minutes before a boat was lowered and Gaffney and Rudeiker were picked up, both exhausted. Rudeiker had evidently changed his mind as to suicide when he reached the cold waters and swam toward his rescuer.

It was on the 4:30 trip yesterday afternoon that Rudeiker was prevented by a deckhand from leaping overboard.
