

Warde Traver Has Exhibit of Beautiful Women

Warde Traver, painter of beautiful women, is exhibiting thirteen of his oils at the Mesnard Gallery, No. 28 East 64th Street, until June 11.

Mr. Traver approaches his portrayal of women by a given formula. The alphabetic requirement is that they must be beautiful. He has in working out his portraits a manifested fondness for the profile and he shows his girls as calendar subjects more than once.

Perhaps the best girl subject in the present exhibition is the one entitled "The Old Fashioned Girl," who is painted in full face and who wears with charm a blue frock with deformed sleeves. Her picture has frames her oval face, which is extremely comely, and her pose is restful.

"The Miami Moon" shows a girl sprit in a party dress, resting lightly upon the stone coping, overlooking a sheet of water upon which the moonlight makes a path that looks for all the world as if one could walk upon it. The tropical palms show clearly behind the glowing skin of the girl.

"Solitude" (also in Florida) shows a curved shore with the light from the setting sun focused upon a seated girl in white satin. The surf breaks gently along the coast line. The colors used are in high key. "The Debutante" is a dear little unsmiling thing in diaphanous yellow, decollete. She carries a fan

and red roses and her hair has been scientifically marcelled. The figure is projected against a dark blue background. The face is high in color.

The apparent decline in the value of the Frick collection that was recently featured in many of the papers is in reality no decline whatever. Knoedler & Co. state that the appraisal of the estate made by a member of their firm and Sir Joseph Duveen, which shows a considerable loss in the values of the various art objects entering into the estate, is far more apparent than real, and the appraisal is based, as is customary, upon a forced sale return, which is less than 50 per cent of the current market transactions.

Not every one can afford the purchase of old masters, of which Mr. Frick had many, and to value these at the prices he paid because of the distinction their possession conferred upon him as a supreme collector, would be manifestly unjust.

Many of the Frick holdings had sentimental value such as belong to first editions and rare objects d'art, but which could not be considered by conservative appraisers.


