

BRINGS SON RICHES; FINDS HE'S IN JAIL

Mother Who Gave Up Boy When Poor Now Goes to Elmira to See Him.

After eighteen years' separation Mrs. Lillian M. Robinson of Church End, London, landed in New York three days ago to offer her son the benefits of a recently inherited fortune.

On calling upon his foster parents, Mr. and Mrs. August Schaller, No. 350 Wilson Avenue, Brooklyn, she learned for the first time that Stanley Schaller is serving a term in the Elmira Reformatory for the larceny of jewelry from a friend of his foster parents.

On hearing Mrs. Robinson's story, Judge Hayes, who sentenced Schaller, said he would take the case up with Gov. Miller and seek to have the boy released in his mother's custody. Stanley is twenty-two years old.

Mrs. Robinson said she gave up her son when she and her first husband were impoverished. She married again in England and, coming into an inheritance recently, determined to take Stanley to England, making over the money to his name. Mrs. Robinson left for Elmira to-day to see her son.

Crushed to Death by Truck.
Patrick McGovern, forty years old, of No. 235 Grove Street, Jersey City, was crushed to death between a truck and a wall at No. 216 West 18th Street to-day, where he was employed by the Monahan Express Company.

ATTACK POLICEMAN GUARDING SALOON

Three Men When Refused Liquor Jump on Patrolman Donnelly.

Patrolman Michael Donnelly of the Alexander Avenue Station, guarding a raided cafe at No. 237 East 12th Street, was attacked last night by three men who entered the place and were refused drinks. Donnelly was severely cut and bruised.

Patrick Laughrey, twenty-nine years old, of No. 391 East 133d Street, and Joseph Corcoran, twenty-eight years old, of No. 2493 Third Avenue, longshoremen, were arrested and identified by Donnelly as his assailants.

When John Campbell, bartender at the cafe, refused the men whiskey they went behind the bar where Donnelly was sitting, knocked him down and kicked him, then fled. Laughrey and Corcoran were found hiding in a yard back of the saloon.

P. O. THIEVES GET 4 YEARS.

Judge Rejects Clemency Plea for Clerks Who Stole \$69,000.

A plea of sympathy was made to-day for Ralph Rosenberg of No. 836 Whitlock Avenue and James E. Dunlay of No. 263 West 112th Street, who pleaded guilty to stealing \$69,000 from the Postal Savings Department of Station 1 of the Post Office. When they were arraigned for sentence, Federal Judge Knox said: "You ask for sympathy, but you had no consideration for your family when you stole this money. You have cost the taxpayers enough money to pay the salary of the President of the United States for a year, or my salary for ten years. I think you have been punished by the disgrace that has come upon you and your family, but I will have to make an example of you."

They were then sentenced to four years each in the Atlanta prison. The money the men stole they lost in gambling.

SAYS HE SAW HER SET FIRE.

After One Incendiary Blaze Tenant Watched and Stopped Another.

After a slight fire of incendiary origin in the five-story tenement, No. 65 East 104th Street, early to-day, the tenants were afraid to go back to bed, sitting up and waiting, John Shapiro, who lives on the first floor, says he saw Julia Williamson, a negro, thirty years old, roll up the hall carpet and start another fire. She was arrested. She denied the charge and was locked up in the East 104th Street Station.

DIES FROM MORPHINE.

Suffering from morphine an unidentified man, well dressed, about twenty-six years old, collapsed last night on the platform of the 72d Street Station of the Second Avenue "L" and died in Metropolitan Hospital on Blackwell's Island. He was 5 feet 7 inches tall, weighed

143 pounds and had brown hair and light complexion. He wore a gray suit and cap and pink underwear. On his chest were tattooed two horses' heads.
