

HOLD 2 ACTRESSES AS DRINKING BOUT KILLS MOVIE MAN

Aid to One of Arbuckle's Guests Dies Suddenly After Party in Los Angeles.

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 10.—An echo of the Arbuckle booze party was heard here to-day when two moving picture actresses were being held in connection with the death of Al Stein, employed by the Century Film Corporation. The coroner says that Stein died of acute alcoholism. The dead man was an assistant of Fred Fishback, the motion picture director, who was a guest at "Fatty" Arbuckle's party in San Francisco at which Miss Virginia Rappe died. The two girls under arrest are Mrs. Jeanne Munroe and Miss Mildred Frances Bellwin, both chorus girls. Detectives who answered a call to Stein's apartment yesterday found Stein on the floor dead, his head propped on two pillows. There was no sign of violence except a scratch on his left cheek. The two girls said that Stein had come home before midnight with three men, all apparently intoxicated. The men remained less than half an hour. An hour later Mr. Stein rolled from bed in great pain, gasping for breath and unable to talk. Mrs. Munroe said she called two physicians, but only one responded. A telegram found in the apartment was addressed to Mrs. Fortlouis. It

was from District Attorney Brady of San Francisco and read: "Please report to District Attorney's office, San Francisco, immediately."

NEWS OF U. S. IN BRIEF

CINCINNATI—Three elderly men dropped dead during the progress of a parade preceding the annual rally of the Holy Name Society here. Heart disease was given as the cause of death in each instance.

ALBANY—A total of 12,125 companies, representing a capitalization of \$15,253,900, have been incorporated in this State during the nine months ended September 30. Of these companies all but 1808, with a capitalization of \$124,827,860, are located in Greater New York.

HEKIMER, N. Y. Justice I. R. Bowerman appointed a jury to inquire into the mental condition of Clinton Scollard of Clinton, the poet, who is being treated in a private sanitarium.

SCOTTDALE, Pa.—Fire, believed to have started in a restaurant here, destroyed property in the business district valued at approximately \$100,000. Twenty-five persons at a hotel in the section burned were forced to flee.

WASHINGTON—The armored cruiser Pittsburgh, formerly the Pennsylvania, will be placed out of commission Oct. 15. Her last active assignment was as flagship of the Mediterranean squadron, with the flag of Rear Admiral Huse.

WASHINGTON—The suggestion that a memorial building be erected in Pittsburgh in memory of the National Guardsmen who gave their lives in the war was met with instant and hearty endorsement. Many letters received favor a memorial building of the character of the Pan-American Building,

which is regarded as the finest example of Spanish architecture in the United States.

MIDDLETOWN, N. J.—By a vote of 34 to 21 at a special session the village of Ottaville, Otsego County, decided to incorporate. An election of village officials will be held in a few days.

CAMBRIDGE, Mass.—An outdoor mass meeting on the Common has marked the opening of a three-day celebration of the seventy-fifth anniversary of Cambridge's incorporation as a city.

PETERSBURG, Ind.—The generator blew up at the Inglis No. 7 mine at Appalachia, Ind., and pieces of a flywheel that weighed four tons were scattered over a radius of two miles. One part, weighing 1,000 pounds, was hurled a mile and a quarter. None of the workmen was injured seriously.


