

WATSON CHARGES ARE FLATLY DENIED BY ARMY OFFICERS

Only Ten Men Hanged Abroad, They Say, and Those for Non-Military Offenses.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 2.—Following the statement by Secretary Weeks that he knew of but ten cases of soldiers being hanged in France, and those for non-military offenses, high army officers here deny the charges of Watson of Georgia made on the floor of the Senate.

Major Gen. Harbord, who was Gen. Pershing's Chief of Staff in France, and who is now Acting Chief of Staff, said he could not recall a single case in which a soldier had been executed in the American Army in France for a purely military offense.

It is known that two men were sentenced to death for having been asleep at their posts, but that, when these cases were referred to former Secretary of War Baker, the sen-

tences were commuted and they were not hanged. In every case coming before the military authorities where purely military offenses were involved, and where hanging was recommended, the death sentences, it was stated at the War Department, had been commuted or lessened.

Major Gen. Robert Lee Bullard, Commander of the First Army Corps Area, characterized as ridiculous Senator Watson's charge that American soldiers in France were executed without trial. When interviewed in his home on Governor's Island, Gen. Bullard dictated this statement:

"Speaking as a regular army officer of forty years' service, having served through all of our operations in France, I have never heard of a soldier of such a thing as the execution of an American soldier without a trial, either in war or in time of peace."

Brig. Gen. William Weigel, who was in command of the 76th Division on this side, and the 25th and 88th Divisions, respectively, in France, described the Watson charges as a "pipe dream" when the substance of the Senator's allegations was given him over the telephone at Camp Dix, N. J.


JURY ATTACKS I. R. T. FOR JEROME SERVICE
