

FIVE DIE IN DAY FROM INJURIES IN AUTO ACCIDENTS

Two Women Among Victims — Backing Car Knocks Down Three Persons.

Rehearsal of a play to be given at the Kew Gardens Country Club had ended Saturday night and participants and spectators were straggling from the building. Horace Krider of No. 281 St. Ann's Avenue, Richmond Hill, said good night to three friends who lived within walking distance of the club and then got into his automobile.

As he backed his car the three persons he had just left turned their backs to him and started waving to friends at the club. The three were Mrs. Marjorie M. Wright, fifty-three, of No. 101 Audley Street, Kew Gardens, and her son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Sohmer, who lived with her and who were participants in the rehearsal.

All three were struck and knocked down by the automobile. Mrs. Wright's head struck the pavement and her skull was fractured. The seriousness of the accident was not realized, and Krider, much grieved, took the three to their home. Mrs. Wright died there early yesterday morning.

Michael Stickler, six, of No. 422 West 26th Street, was run over and killed by an automobile truck at Ninth Avenue and 26th Street last night. The truck driver, Owen McArdle of No. 59 Ninth Avenue, was arrested.

C. David Bigley, fifty-two, of No. 1240 Park Avenue, Plainfield, N. J., was struck by an automobile as he was riding home on his bicycle Monday night. His injuries caused his

death yesterday. Ernest M. Smalley of No. 312 Mountain Avenue, Plainfield, driver of the car, was arrested and held in \$3,000 bail for the Grand Jury.

Mrs. Frederick Hoyt, twenty-two, of Cross Hill, Westport, Conn., died in Mount Vernon Hospital yesterday from injuries received in an automobile accident on Nov. 20. She was seated in the car with her husband, while their chauffeur examined the motor, when another car crashed into them from behind. The husband suffered internal injuries, but is now out of danger.

Jesse Nickerson, seventy-four, of Peekskill, one of the best known building contractors in Westchester County, died yesterday in Peekskill Hospital of injuries suffered when he was struck by an automobile two days ago. For fifteen years he was Chief of Police of Peekskill. He is survived by a son and daughter.

BOY, 16, CONVICTED FOR SEVENTH TIME

Parents Give Youth Up as Beyond Reform.

Magistrate Jesse Silbermann in the Morrisania Police Court, the Bronx, today committed to the New York City Reformatory Julius Obsbaum, sixteen, of No. 388 Ocean View Avenue, Brooklyn. It was the boy's seventh commitment, according to Probation Officer Coyle.

When he was nine he was arrested for larceny and since then he has been committed to various institutions for burglary and lesser crimes. He was arrested as a powder last week at Cauldwell Avenue and 156th Street, the Bronx, by Police Reservist Katz of the Simpson Street Station. His parents

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refused to appear in court, having given up hope of reforming him.


