

ROOKIE, I.L. FIGHTS GANG, BADLY CUT

Policeman Off Duty Answers Hold-Up Victims' Call and Is Seriously Wounded.

James Brady, twenty-five, of No. 215 Avenue A, who has not been a policeman long, reported ill at the desk of the Fifth Street Station at 11 o'clock last night, was excused and started for home. He was in civilian clothing but had his revolver in his hip pocket.

At 13th Street and Second Avenue he saw two men running and they reported they had been held up and robbed by "that gang over on the corner" pointing to 14th Street, where eight men stood.

When Brady went to investigate he was attacked but knocked down two of his assailants. A third cut at his throat and made a deep knife wound under his jaw. Brady was taken to Bellevue Hospital in a serious condition.

His assailants fled and the men who reported the hold-up disappeared.

Another policeman saw the fight and started to investigate, not knowing a policeman was involved, but the eight men ran off before he could intercept any of them.

AUTOMOBILE TRUCK KILLS FOUR-YEAR-OLD BROOKLYN GIRL

Catherine Caputo, four years old, of No. 2153 Pitkin Avenue, Brooklyn, was killed last night when an automobile truck owned by Michael Paul of No. 142 West 122d Street, Manhattan, ran over her as she was crossing the street. It is believed the child slipped and fell as the truck was passing and was caught under the rear wheel, which crushed her to death. Timothy Collins, driver of the automobile, was exonerated from blame.

NATIONAL SURETY LOSES OLD RECORDS IN FIRE

Papers Burned in Blaze in Company's Maiden Lane Office.

Old records of the National Surety Company, which recently quit the bail bond business, were destroyed at 4 A. M. to-day in a fire on the second floor of No. 31 Maiden Lane, where the company has its brokers' branch and headquarters department. Its main offices are at No. 115 Broadway.

Policeman Buckley of the Old Slip Station discovered the blaze in the seven-story building and ran around to the quarters of Engine Company No. 4 and told the firemen. The flames were extinguished before they had done much damage or spread to other floors. The loss was not estimated.
