**CALL OFFICER SANE  
AT COURT MARTIAL**

Major Nicholson Not Affected by Gunshot Wound, Doctor Testifies.

CAMP DIX, N. J., June 5.—Major Malcolm Wheeler Nicholson, charged with infringement of military discipline in sending a letter to President Harding charging that there is "Prussianism" in the regular army, was declared to be in "perfect mental health" in a report submitted at his court martial to-day. The report was given by Major J. A. Bethea, Chief Surgeon of the Camp Dix Hospital, head of a medical committee which examined Major Nicholson for four hours.

Major Fowler, of counsel for the defense, asked Major Bethea if a gun shot wound in the head which Major Nicholson received last year might not have affected the officer's mental state. "It would not," Major Bethea replied.

The letter to the President, which Major Nicholson wrote from Walter Reed Hospital following the accidental shooting at Camp Dix in which he was wounded in the head, was introduced in evidence.

**SOVIET LETS DOWN BARS ON  
PARCEL POST.**

MOSCOW, June 5.—A new decree of the Soviet provided that clothing, shoes, food and printed matter may be sent by parcel post from abroad when addressed to individuals in Russia for personal use without special permission, subject to customs. Parcels must be limited to twelve pounds each.

**CANADA'S UNEMPLOYED  
PICKET PARLIAMENT**

Loss of Patience Quickly and the Back to Billings.

OTTAWA, Ont., June 5.—For about twenty minutes this morning, "General" Riley's army of unemployed which had marched from Toronto, sat in silent siege of the Parliament buildings, then marched back to barracks.

Pruned every consideration and sympathetic treatment by the Prime Minister and by Hon. H. S. Beland, Minister of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment, at an interview between the "army" executive and the Government, "General" Riley declared his men would remain in front of the buildings until a specific answer was received. Twenty minutes later he ordered a withdrawal.

**"MAN WITHOUT A COURT,"  
IS JUSTICE GAVEGAN**

Attentions Cause Adjournment Until Next Monday.

Supreme Court Justice Gavegan, returning to the County Court House to-day, after sitting for a month in the Bronx, found himself without a court room. Workmen are engaged in remodeling quarters for him, and Justice Gavegan was forced to adjourn until Monday.
