

COAST TO COAST FLAG FLIGHT FOR YOUNG AMERICA

Jersey City Club Making
Plans for Historic Event
Next Year.

A coast-to-coast flag flight, sponsored by the Jersey City Rotary Club, started in its preliminary stages to-day when Samuel Abbott, who originated and superintended the Roosevelt flag flight through New York State in 1918, left Jersey City to pave the way for Old Glory's trip from Jersey City to San Francisco early next year. When he arrives in San Francisco he will have presented credentials as a representative of the Rotary Club to seventy-eight municipalities and made arrangements whereby Young America will carry a flag by relay from the New England battlefield of Lexington to the Golden Gate, studding in a field of forty-eight stars, on the way.

In years to come tourists at the Lincoln Memorial in Washington will see the only flag in America that has been draped around every shrine dear to American hearts.

Abbott's plans provide for an airplane flight from Jersey City on April 19, 1923, carrying the flag to Lexington. Then will be started the transcontinental relay. Boston will next receive the flag for its dedication to the memory of Bunker Hill. At Worcester it will repose in the home of Clara Barton, founder of the American Red Cross. At Hartford it will join a great galaxy of American flags in the State House, and in New Haven will be draped tenderly over the statue of the martyred Nathan Hale in the Yale yard.

Then the flag will pass through New York, where its first resting place will be the recently unveiled monument to the "Dying Soldier." Thence it will be relayed by New York boys to Grant's Tomb, later to the graves of Lawrence in Trinity Graveyard, and finally to the steps of the Sub-Treasury, where the statue of Washington marks the place where he delivered the first inaugural address.

The flag will then be borne across the Hudson to Jersey City, where it will grace the monument that tells the story of the Battle of Paulus Hook, and then to the home of Albert L. Quinn, one of the thousands of American boys who made the sacri-


fice in the World War. On through New Jersey to Princeton and its historic battlefield, to Philadelphia, Independence Hall, where the Declaration of Independence was signed and the house where Betsy Ross fashioned the Stars and Stripes. As it passes Fort Mifflin, Md., verses of the Star Spangled Banner, written there by Francis Scott Key, will resound. The Hall of Congress, Arlington Cemetery, Mount Vernon, the Lee home in Alexandria, Va., the battlefield of Gettysburg, the home of McKinley in Ohio, the grave of Lincoln at Springfield, and Council Bluffs, where Lewis and Clark first displayed the Stars and Stripes to

the Indians in 1804, will be among the other places visited on the way.
