

IDEAL MOTOR TRIP THROUGH RUGGED ALLEGHENY M'TS.

Passes Through New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Maryland—Generally Good.

Motorists who like touring through mountain sections will find the route through the Alleghenies interesting and attractive.

The Automobile Club of America through its Chief Roadman outlines the route as follows:

The main trunk line between New York and Philadelphia lies over the Lincoln Highway, which goes through Newark, New Brunswick and Princeton to Trenton, and this is all in good condition. From Trenton on the Highway is very good.

Motorists can get into Pennsylvania over the South New Jersey trunk line, which is in fair condition at the present time, by going through Freehold to Lakewood, then through Atlantic City route to Pleasantville, where the trunk line can be joined which connects with the Penn Grove Ferry to Wilmington.

A good road is available into Philadelphia from Absecon. The Lincoln Highway, which goes west out of Philadelphia, via the Old Lancaster Pike, is all open and in good condition to Pittsburgh. Leaving Philadelphia, the first ten miles are through a pretty residential section to Bryn Mawr, where the famous woman's college is located. From there on the country is more open and rolling and the Lincoln Highway passes through many small farms and communities with the land in a splendid state of cultivation all the way to Gettysburg. The cities of Coatesville, Lancaster and York are also passed.

From Gettysburg, South Mountain is crossed via Black Cap, where the Pennsylvania State Forest is located. Chambersburg. The route is a fairly level stretch entering the foothills of the Alleghenies at McConnellsburg. From McConnellsburg commences the ascent of Cove Mountain, which rises just beyond Inspiration Point, also known as Grand View.

After crossing Cove Mountain, Terrace Mountain is crossed via Salustia Grade, reaching about the same altitude. Just beyond Brezewood the Ragston branch of the Juniata River is crossed and followed to Bedford, where good hotel accommodations are available and a detour to the west can be continued through the mountains via the Lincoln Highway over Laurel Ridge and Chestnut Ridge to Greensburg and then on to Pittsburgh.

From Pittsburgh run south to Washington, Pa., connecting with the Old National Trails. From Washington, Pa., the return trip is made by running east to Uniontown, again entering the foothills of the Alleghenies and following a scenic, hard-surfaced road which winds around through the mountains, to most prominent known locally as Negro Mountain, Meadow Mountain and the Snake Mountain, to Cumberland, in the heart of the Alleghenies.

This is a delightful spot to visit for a few days. On leaving Cumberland, Martin Mountain, Warrior, Polish, Green Ridge, Town Hill and Siding Hill are crossed and Hagerstown. From Hagerstown to Baltimore the road is hard surfaced and in excellent condition, traversing charming country which is "up hill and down dale" all
