

HOUSEWIVES' GUIDE Of Market Prices

Monday's auction of Pacific Coast fruit, oranges, lemons, grapes and apples, realized prices slightly lower than for the same day one year ago.

Apples of the best grade are some higher this week, in spite of the fact that the warm weather has not been conducive to a brisk trade.

Receipts of fresh white eggs continue low and the market remains firm with the top wholesale figure of 84 cents per dozen for extra New Jersey eggs.

stock contains a high percentage of defective eggs, due in part to over-long holding at country shipping points for larger values, and only a small part of the total supply of fresh eggs is good enough to exceed a range of 40 to 41 cents per dozen.

Supplies of fish are plentiful with prices dropping for the better class fish, like salmon and bluefish, from 10 to 20 cents per pound.

Warm weather has left its mark on the condition of onions sent to the local market and the slow demand which characterizes the present week.
