

**East Side Soldier Memorial
To Perpetuate Immigrant Valor
Suggested by The Evening World**

All Races and Creeds of the Section Working Enthusiastically for Plan Endorsed by Leaders of Nation.

Much enthusiasm is being manifested on the east side for the East Side Soldier Memorial to be erected at Clinton and Delance Streets, facing the Williamsburg Bridge, under the direction of Harry H. Schlacht, President of the Downtown Chamber of Commerce. Leading merchants and bankers have joined in the movement to commemorate the valor of the immigrants and sons of immigrants who played a valiant role on the battlefields of Europe.

Immediately following the signing of the armistice, The Evening World suggested the idea of this soldier tribute. During the operation of The Evening World's Americanization Forum, thousands of east side people attending the exercises applauded the suggestion.

Heartiest personal indorsement of the soldier memorial have come from President Harding, ex-President Wilson, General Pershing, Secretary of War Weeks, Secretary of Labor Davis, Secretary of the Navy Denny, Governor Miller, Col. Theodore Roosevelt, and a score of leading men and women throughout the Nation.

Wounded soldiers, Gold Star mothers and school children have gone to the offices of the chamber giving suggestions, ideas and designs for the memorial. Every home in the tenement section, every race, color and creed, acted in co-operation.

"When the glad tidings was announced to the world that the war had come to an end, The Evening World suggested this east side soldier tribute," says President Schlacht.

"In its editorial and news columns it made a public appeal for support. I was gratified beyond expression at this public-spirited effort and felt that our people would respond to bring about success. A considerable period of time had elapsed, but the ardor and the enthusiasm of our people did not wane. They felt that something must be done to honor the memory of our heroes."

In praise of the memorial Woodrow Wilson's letter to Mr. Schlacht reads: "The movement of your organization to establish a soldier monument in the heart of the east side ghetto—"

In memory of the immigrants and sons of immigrants who made the supreme sacrifice in the last war—has my warm approval, and I wish it complete success."

General Pershing's letter reads: "You and your associates are to be commended for your interest in this undertaking, and you have my full and hearty indorsement of this movement to thus perpetuate the memory of those brave adopted sons of America who died in her behalf. Every success to you."

**INFANT AT HER PLAY

The mother smelled gas and rushed into the kitchen to find her lying on the floor and one room filled with gas escaping from an open jet on the stove.

**GIRL DRINKS POISON
IN SUICIDE ATTEMPT**

Collapses in Street and Passerby Takes Her to Hospital.

A girl who described herself as Ross Moore, nineteen, living at the Hotel Chelsea, No. 222 West 23d Street, was taken early this morning to Bellevue Hospital from Roosevelt Hospital suffering from iodine poisoning. She attempted to end her life, the police say.

The girl collapsed at Seventh Avenue and 62d Street. Frank Burrows of No. 424 64th Street, Brooklyn, ran to her assistance and she told him she had just swallowed iodine.

Burrows placed her in a taxi and took her to Roosevelt Hospital where Dr. Penna found she was not in a serious condition.

**PLAN VACCINATION
OF DOGS FOR RABIES**

Hudson County, N. J., Health Officials Meet to Consider Scheme.

Representatives of Health Departments of seven cities of northern Hudson County, N. J., will meet on Nov. 22 at Union Hill to set on a plan of Dr. William J. Sweeney of that town to vaccinate every dog in the county with a new serum to prevent rabies.

This serum, Dr. Sweeney says, has been used with remarkable success in several countries, particularly Japan. It is planned to charge dog owners a nominal fee for vaccination. Each of the municipalities pay about \$500 a year for Pasteur treatment. It also is planned to have the S. P. C. A. round up all homeless dogs.
