

TO PUBLISH NAMES OF K. K. K.; GEGAN'S SQUAD ON ITS TRAIL

Stands Put on Job to Find Empire—Unity League Opens Office.

Militant measures to obtain New York City of the Ku Klux Klan and all its works began in earnest yesterday.

The American Unity League, headquarters of the Klan, opened headquarters, and announced that shortly it would publish in its journal, Tolerance, the names of 500 Klansmen weekly until the entire New York membership has been revealed.

Assistant District Attorney Ferdinand Pecora and Detective Sergeant James J. Gegan and his famous botul squad on the trail of the Klan, Gegan and his men have the reputation of always "getting their man."

The Rev. Dr. Oscar Haywood, william evangelist attached to Pastor John Roach Straton's Calvary Baptist Church, will be invited to-day to visit the District Attorney's office and answer truthfully questions about the Klan, its personnel and its methods of work in New York City.

Grady K. Rutledge, Executive Secretary of the American Unity League, said the first issue of Tolerance, containing the first 500 names, will be on the newsstands in about three weeks.

"You will behold what we believe in Chicago," he said. "We had Klansmen flocking to our office every day begging that they be named."

Four investigators for the American Unity League have been at work in New York City for weeks and have just completed gathering their most important data, he declared.

"We are not ready to turn over our Government, based upon many years' experience, to the Ku Klux Klan, and we are not going to do so," declared Gov. John M. Parker of Louisiana after addressing the Association of Life Insurance Presidents at their luncheon yesterday in the Hotel Astor.

The Southern Executive, who went to Washington as the result of suspicions of murders having been committed by Klansmen and discussed a proposal for the Federal Government to put down the Invisible Empire, denounced the Klan as a growing menace.

Asked what would destroy the Klan, he said the ridiculous side of it—grown men going around at night pretending to enforce the law in nightgowns.

Gov. Parker did not think there was a chance of the Klan reaching such proportions as the Fascist in Italy.

"The best thing to fight it with is enlightenment," he said. "There are many good men in the Klan, but a large number of them who went into it thoughtlessly are now getting out of it. These people make the claim they want to help the law, but they cannot come forward and show a specific instance in which they have done so."

ATHENS IS WORK CENTRE FOR DR. MABEL ELLIOTT

New Medical Director Takes Over All Relief Work in Greece.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Dec. 8.—Dr. Mabel Elliott of Benton Harbor, Mich., who has been appointed by the Near East Relief as General Medical Director of all American relief work in Greece and the Greek Islands, received word from New York to-day that the American Women's Hospitals have appropriated \$100,000 for medical work among the Smyrnan, Anatolian and Thracian refugees.

The message came prior to her departure for Athens, where her new headquarters are to be. Dr. Elliott has been in charge of American medical relief work in Armenia for the last two years.

SCHOOL DESTROYED BY FIRE—REBUILT

The public school building at Hawthorn, N. J., was totally destroyed by fire shortly after midnight, the loss amounting to between \$15,000 and \$20,000. Prosecutor A. C. Hart has sent a county detective to investigate the fire, which is reported to have been of incendiary origin.

CRISSINGER MAY BE NAMED TO HEAD FEDERAL RESERVE

President Yields to Farm Bloc, Which Has Opposed Gov. Harding.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.—David R. Crissinger, Comptroller of the Currency and President Harding's home town banker friend, has been informally decided upon for appointment as Governor of the Federal Reserve Board, to succeed W. P. G. Harding, it is learned.

Announcement of the appointment is expected shortly. In deciding upon Mr. Crissinger, President Harding is understood to have yielded reluctantly to the pressure brought upon him by the Western farm bloc, which the Administration is wooing. The Western group lay most of their filia to the board's policy of deflation in 1920 and held Gov. Harding chiefly responsible for its application.

The appointment will leave a vacancy in the office of Comptroller which may be filled by Eugene Meyer Jr., head of the War Finance Corporation.

Supporters of former Gov. W. P. G. Harding are still hoping they may secure a revision of the present plan. Mr. Harding, who has been re-organizing the finances of Cuba, is expected to return to Washington in about ten days.

It has been known that the President has had Mr. Crissinger in mind as a possible appointee. The decision, said to have been reached within the last twenty-four hours, is rather a surprise.

The President, it is understood, does not share in the Western viewpoint of the policies pursued by his manœuvre's title Governor of the Board, but his advisers have told him it would be inviting trouble to reappoint Mr. Harding.
