

CIGARETS FROM U. S. COST MILLION RUBLES EACH IN MOSCOW NOW

Fluctuation of Soviet Paper Money Boosts Cigarette 500,000 Rubles Overnight.

MOSCOW, Dec. 29. The Bolshevik ruble has been fluctuating to such an extent lately that it has become a common occurrence for dealers to boost many articles billions of rubles overnight. These were principally diamonds, gold and platinum jewelry, furs and other luxuries sought by speculators, the "quadrillionaires" and others with loads of the Soviet paper cash.

One day the ruble dropped to 25,000,000 to the dollar, and two days later flopped back again to 27,000,000 to the dollar, where it remained "stabilized" for several weeks. During this period the street carefare on the Moscow tram was increased in one jump from 500,000 rubles to 1,000,000 for a single ride.

American made cigarettes are now on sale in the streets of Moscow for about one million Soviet rubles each.

HEARINGS FOR FEDERAL CHILD LABOR CONTROL

Senate Sub-Committee Plans for Constitutional Amendment.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 29.—The Senate Judiciary sub-committee will begin hearings Jan. 19 for legislation submitting a proposed constitutional amendment to authorize Congress to regulate child labor. It was announced today. It was said it will hear representatives of organizations interested in the extension of Federal jurisdiction over the age at which children may be employed, and the sanitary conditions under which they may work.

Members of the sub-committee, which is composed of Senators Shorridge, Republican, California; Colt, Republican, Rhode Island; and Walsh, Democrat, Montana, said today the hearings would be expedited as much as possible.


