CIVIL COURTS.

FRIDAY, Dec. 3. In the Court of Common Pleas, an action was brought by William Gattiker against Jay S. Mackay, Jacob Acker, and Gattiker for false imprisonment. Mr. Acker, in conjunction with Mr. Samuel N. Stubbs, had a case in Chancery, which went by default. Mr. Mackay was counsel in the suit, and demanded the costs. Messrs. B. & S. waived until the 11th. Mr. David Graham, who had acted for them, came from Albany. He reported that the Court of Chancery had issued a writ of imprisonment from the law to do so. The Sheriff and his Deputy arrested the parties, they were held to bail and remained on the limits for about six weeks. There were extraordinary circumstances in the case, particularly in Mr. Mackay and the officers not being aware that they were violating the writ. The jury gave a verdict for plaintiff in the sum of \$150 as regarded Mr. Mackay, and for defendant in respect to the other two, subject to the opinion of the Court on certain points of law.

COTTON.—The sales to-day have been very light. Yesterday they reached 1200 bales, at about 1/2 decline.

FLOUR.—Genesee continues depressed, and although the large holders ask \$6.50, yet they seldom receive 6 1/2 and sales have been made, we have reason to believe, even lower. Ohio 6 1/2 at 6 1/2. Southern is without change.

GRAIN.—Sales of 3500 bushels Illinois Wheat at 130. Small lots of Northern and Jersey Corn at 70. Oats plenty, and dull at 45 to 50 for Northern. No Southern in market.

Review of the New-York Market.

FOR THE WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 1.

ASHES.—Pots are in demand for export at \$6.400 bbls. have sold since our last week's report at about that rate.

Few or no sales of Pearls. We quote at \$5.62. The stock of Pots is about 2500 bbls.

COAL.—Nova Scotia is plenty and dull. We notice 250 chaldrons Sydney at \$7.75, 4 tons, and 70, at \$8. cash; Schuylkill \$7.50 a ton from the yard.

COTTON.—On Saturday last there was quite an active demand for home use and export, and fully 9000 bales were disposed of on that day. The sales on Monday were but about 100, and Tuesday 650 bales. Some holders have evinced a desire to press sales, and prices generally may be considered 1/2 cent per lb. below those current a week ago.

FLOUR AND MEAL.—Holders of Western Flour on Saturday limited to a further decline of 1/4 cent per bushel. The common brands Genesee being taken for export to London on that day at \$3.50. On Monday 1000 bbls. were also sold for shipment at the same price.

With these exceptions, there has been almost perfect inactivity about the market, and only a few scattered sales. The receipts for a few days past have been increasing, and prices, especially of the late arrivals, are quite unsettled. We quote Genesee \$6.60, Ohio and Troy \$6.37 1/2, and Michigan \$6.25 to \$6.37 1/2, with a few sales of the latter at \$6.25. We understand that the foreign orders now here for the shipment of Flour to England are limited below present rates; the recent advance in freights also tends to prevent their execution to this extent, and the excessive dullness must be attributed to the fact that the market is over-supplied, and, as yet, are for the most part firm, and we do not vary our quotations. 1000 lbs. Richmond City Mills, to arrive, have been sold for export to South America at \$7.50, cash. We quote Rice Flour, \$1.15, which is a shade higher than a week ago.
