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Social Science. [Communicated by the Friends of Association.] We invite the attention of the reader to the following article which is the Introduction to the Second Edition of the Pamphlet on Association now in press:

The present system of Society is evidently false and defective; this we believe is abundantly proved by the fact that Evil and Misery under innumerable forms, moral and material, are universally prevalent in Society, harassing and blighting to a greater or less extent the existence of all classes, of the Rich as well as the Poor.

It is time that this Truth, as absolute in its character as a mathematical problem, was generally felt and understood, and that it was acted upon by the People and the Leaders of the People, as it must be if they wish to attain a better and a happier condition of Society.

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4th. The institutions and tendencies of the Associated or Combined Order are in perfect harmony with the highest conceptions of truth, justice and love entertained in theory by the world, and which are embodied in the doctrines of Christ.

Christianity has been grafted upon and developed in the antique Pagan Society—that is, the Greek and Roman Civilization—which social organization, with slight superficial modifications, has been continued down to the present time, and constitutes what is called Modern Civilization.

The System of Society propounded by CHARLES FOURIER, and which we are now laboring to realize in practice, is based upon those laws of Order and Harmony which govern the Universe, the divine laws of Attraction and Repulsion, the universality of which, and their application to the Moral government of Man, as well as the Mechanical movement of Material things, were first discovered by that great genius, Fourier.

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
