The Election—The Official Result.

The result of the late election, a officially determined, will be found below. It varies but a few votes from that given by our returns. The difference is accounted for by an error in our return of the vote of Somerset, by 31 more scattering votes returned to the Secretary of State than to us, by a small error in our listing up of the vote of Franklin County, by a slight error in our return of Goodwin's vote in Madison, and by our having a return from Pinkham's Grant, which was not returned to the Secretary of State. With these corrections, the aggregate votes returned to us, differs only about ten votes from the official returns.

The vote of Somerset, as the official return gives it, is—

Woodbury 74, Goodwin 167, Hale 134.

By a mistake of the Town Clerk, Woodbury's vote is returned as for John T. Woodbury. In the following table it is included in Woodbury's vote.

The vote of Plaitist, it appearing illegal by the return itself, was not counted by the Governor and Council.
