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THE NEWS FROM THE OLD WORLD BY THE PACIFIC. Dates from Liverpool to June 19, London 15, and Paris 17.

ENGLAND. The Ministry and the Greek Question. The following article from the London Globe, the organ of Lord Palmerston, will be read with interest at the present crisis.

ENGLAND. We have refrained from dwelling on Lord Stanley's notice of his motion for Monday next, out of a natural wish to avoid the risk of embarrassing the negotiations pending between our Government and that of France.

ENGLAND. We are indeed at a loss to conceive how the negotiations at Athens and the causes of their rupture can be discussed without apportioning the share of blame due to either ligant; but it is out of the question to suppose that an English statesman voluntarily step forward to make a statement in a foreign Parliament, and thwart Lord Palmerston's honorable hopes of vindicating his own position without giving just cause of umbrage to his ally.

ENGLAND. Lord Stanley evidently composed the terms of the motion, and he will probably speak on Monday evening, under the same intemperate and unscrupulous irritation, with which Lord Palmerston's professional antagonists have deservedly announced the means taken for enforcing Mr. Wye's claims on the Greek Cabinet.

ENGLAND. The public had been informed (and, for all we know, had begun to believe) that the apportionment of blame for the Greek question, the first publication on the subject, showed that Baron Gros, a warm partizan of the Greek cause, was himself so utterly unable to deny the principle of the indemnity claimed on behalf of M. Pacilio, that on the 16th of April he actually proposed to set aside 150 shares, of 1,000 drachmas each, of the Bank of Greece, in satisfaction of the claims of the English Government.

ENGLAND. These were points on which no other country in the world would have allowed its demands for satisfaction to be deferred for a single week, and on which it would have been too desperate an undertaking to get up a cry against Lord Palmerston.

ENGLAND. We have acknowledged the propriety of Lord Stanley's motion, and we are confident that the original justice of our claims, and the means taken by Lord Palmerston for enforcing them.

ENGLAND. We believe that the discovery of the responsible statesman of the Conservative party,—the men whose former countenance lends all their respectability to the opinions of Lord Stanley and Lord Aberdeen—have markedly refused to mix themselves up in the controversy, and have shown that they are a higher tone in the ascertained interests of our country and government, than on the civilizing "diplomatic drawing-rooms," which are flattered by Lord Palmerston's untimely assertion of our national rights, and the zeal of his hearty Liberalism.

Wreck of the Orion—Fifty Lives Lost. The following detailed particulars of this distressing event are printed from late editions of the North British Mail, (Diagong paper), which were published in succession up to six o'clock, Tuesday, June 18.
