THE TICKETS FOR JENNY LIND'S SECOND CONCERT.

At the second sale of tickets for Jenny Lind's second concert, on Saturday, Sept. 23, the tickets were sold at a premium, the first sale being obtained at \$5 per premium, by the Rev. Mr. Ross. A large number of the tickets, from \$4 to \$5 per premium, were sold at \$1 and \$2. It looks now as if the receipts to the second concert might be about \$12,000. The Germans in Boston, to the number of about 500, are to have a torch light procession in honor of Miss Lind.

THE LATE RAILROAD ACCIDENT.

The Coroner's Inquest upon the bodies of Thomas Johnson and Betsey Kendrick who were killed on the N. Y. & E. R. Railroad, on the 24th inst. was concluded last night and the following verdict was rendered: "That the said Thomas Johnson and Betsey Kendrick came to their deaths from wounds and injuries received while in a railroad car, and that the said railroad car was derailed in consequence of the negligence of the engineer in charge of the car, who was on the track. And the Jurors upon their oath say they have examined the place where the accident occurred, and it appears from the evidence that the negligence of the engineer was owing in the first place to the insufficiency and a lack of force on the north side of the railroad track to prevent cattle from coming on the track and to the insufficiency of the cattle guards near the brick yard, to prevent cattle from passing on the track; and in the next place to the want of due care on the part of William Thomas, the Engineer, who had the direction and care of the Engine at the time of the accident, and the care thrown off the track in witness whereof &c.

TRIBUNE'S SPECIAL DISPATCHES.

Confirmations in the Senate—Fight between Foote and Fremont. (Special Dispatch to the Tribune.) WASHINGTON, Saturday, Sept. 23.

About thirty confirmations took place in the Senate last night, among which were all the nominations for Utah, which you have already received.

There was a fight, about 9 o'clock, in the ante-chamber, between FOOTE and FREMONT. Probably there will be a duel. It was caused by an attack on one of FREMONT'S bills.
