CHURCH CONSECRATION.—The new edifice of the English Evangelical Lutheran Church of St. James, situated in Fifteenth street, between the Second and Third avenues, was consecrated last Sabbath morning. The Rev. Dr. Smith of Columbia College conducted the preliminary exercises. Dr. Stork of Palisades read the 94th Psalm, which was then chanted by the choir. The consecration services were performed by Dr. Pohlman of Albany. The morning discourse was delivered by the Rev. J. L. Shock, pastor of the Church. In the afternoon, Dr. Pohlman occupied the pulpit. The evening's discourse was preached by Dr. Stork. The audience on each of these occasions was large, filling the Church to its utmost capacity. The organ is a new one from the manufactory of Hall & Lebeau of this city; it was purchased and presented to the Church by the ladies of the congregation. The collections taken up during the day were much more liberal than were expected in the present financial troubles of the country. The edifice itself is Gothic—built of Connecticut blue stone, with brown stone trimmings. It has a tower and spire two hundred feet high, constructed of the same material. The interior of the Church is especially chaste and beautiful. The ceiling—ribbed in plaster and frescoed—the stained glass windows, the recess behind the pulpit, with its beautiful arch—the chancel, with its pulpit, communion table and reading-desk of black walnut, and baptismal font of white marble—all combine to make it one of the most attractive Church-interiors of this city. From a statement read by the pastor, we learn that the entire cost of the Church, with the ground and furniture, amounts to about \$60,000.

ROUGH AND TUMBLE BETWEEN TWO DISTINGUISHED PERFORMERS.—It is well known that for some time past a great deal of ill-feeling has existed between the well-known Ethiopian minstrel, Mr. George Christy, and Mr. A. H. Davenport, the popular actor at Wallack's Theater—the ill-feeling being the result of certain circumstances of a private and domestic nature. On Wednesday night about 6 1/2 p. m., Mr. Davenport was proceeding along Broadway, when just as he was passing the Oyster Bay Saloon, Mr. Christy emerged therefrom. BROOKLYN ITEMS.

THE BANK.—The "banks" of a few days past has entirely ceased. The banks are no longer crowded with anxious holders of notes, or those demanding payment for claims. The throngs which congregated at the doors of the banking institutions of Williamsburgh have departed, and have given place to those who have legitimate business to transact. At the Williamsburgh City Bank yesterday, several thousands of dollars were deposited in gold by parties who, a few days since, were fearful of the solvency of it, as well as every other bank in the city. So far as the banking institutions of Williamsburgh are concerned, the panic has entirely subsided. The Williamsburgh Savings Bank, yesterday afternoon presented quite a contrast to that of the day before. From the time of opening until the close but few persons were present, and the majority of these for the purpose of depositing, rather than drawing funds. The business yesterday attained about the average that it was previous to the recent excitement. There were but little larger drafts than there were deposits, but nothing that could be construed into a "run" was perceived.

FARMERS' AND CITIZENS' BANK.—On Wednesday Judge Birdseye, of the Supreme Court, appointed Orris M. Beach, esq., late Cashier of the Bank, Receiver, on the application of Richard Tueddel, the holder of Mr. Beach's note. Anthony, and George Field, Cashier of the Williamsburgh City Bank—for an order vacating the appointment of Mr. Beach as Receiver, inasmuch as the assignees and some of the principal stockholders were, it is alleged, not represented on the application.
