THE ATTITUDE OF RUSSIA.

Removed Trouble between Austria and Prussia.

MUNICH, July 21, 1859.

Three weeks ago the tone of feeling in the middle States of Germany was overbearing and arrogant. It was supposed that they held the destiny of Europe in their hands, and that they could use their power in a manner to relieve them of the danger of being eventually crushed between Prussia and Austria.

The truth is, throughout the whole affair, Germany, including Prussia, has lagged a full month behind the march of events. Her statesmen are not gifted with the faculty of understanding times and seasons. They never take time by the forelock.
