THE BLACKWELL'S ISLAND ABUSES.

THE CORONER'S JURY VISIT THE PENITENTIARY—NUMEROUS WITNESSES TO BE CALLED—A THOROUGH INVESTIGATION TO BE MADE BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF CHARITIES AND CORRECTION.

Yesterday afternoon Coroner Croker, accompanied by Deputy Coroner Cushman and nine of the jurymen subpoenaed on the request of Michael Connelly, visited Blackwell's Island for the purpose of getting the names of the witnesses who are to testify as to the custody and treatment of the prisoners at the penitentiary.

Among the keepers, the coroner took the names of Michael Kennedy, Timothy Skelly and Charles Osborne. The jury was shown the cell in which Connelly died. The cell—No. 400—was locked and without the usual fixtures. It was measured by one of the jurymen, and found to be six feet nine inches long and four feet wide.

At their meeting yesterday, the Commissioners of Charities and Correction ordered a copy of the testimony taken at the penitentiary to be brought to the office of the District Attorney Phelps, for such action as he may deem proper.
