

THE CITY'S WATER SUPPLY.

ENGINEER CHURCH'S NEW PLAN. A SCHEME TO GET ADDITIONAL WATER IN A REASONABLY SHORT TIME.

The Aqueduct Commission yesterday gave a hearing to persons who are interested in the proposed new Croton Bridge. The Commission has expressed its admiration of Mr. Church's plan, and thought it solved the problem of procuring an additional supply of Croton water within a reasonably short time.
