ELEVATED RAILROAD TRAINS.

COLONEL HAIN SAYS THEY RUN AS OFTEN AS EVER
—FARES NOT LIKELY TO GO UP.

Yesterday Colonel F. K. Hain, general manager of
the Manhattan Elevated Railway, was asked regarding
a letter to the Editor of the Tribune, complaining of
a shortening of the trains on the West Side from five
to four cars and the increase of intervals from five to ten
minutes from Franklin-st. on the sixth-ave. road.
The letter is as follows:

The recent change of schedule on the elevated road is
a gross outrage on the public. The substitution of four-
car trains for five-car trains—so that a five-car train is
no more to be seen—and the change from five-car trains
on ten minutes headway from Franklin-st. to four-car
trains on twelve minutes headway, indicate an economy
at the expense of the public that is very painful to the
latter. Especially so when one sees idle cars on the
sidings. There is no excuse for such actions on the part
of a corporation that ought gladly to furnish facilities
for getting up town to its fullest extent. Trains of five
cars should leave Franklin-st. every five minutes at most.
If the officials responsible for this latest outrage had to
ride on their four-car trains during the busy hours, it
would soon be changed. With longer, less crowded
trains, the delays at the stations would be avoided.

Colonel Hain exclaimed: "It isn't true; I won't
answer such complaints. People who are on the outside
seem to think that they can run our road better than
we can who manage it." Then he added: "We
have recently issued a new schedule of trains, which
is an improved one. We are running as many trains
as ever, and the trains are only two minutes apart
in the busy hours. We have no idle cars; every one
is held to handle the traffic."

There was a renewal of rumors regarding an increase
of fares on the Manhattan Elevated Railway in Wall
Street yesterday. Vice-President Galloway gave the
same answer he has given for a long time when the
matter was called to his attention. He said that the
subject had not been discussed by the Board of Direc-
tors and he knew of no movement on foot in this direc-
tion. It is understood that the active managers
are opposed to any change in fares, and all the talk
about it has been informal and largely suggested
by the newspapers.


