Foreign.—The cholera record: Hamburg (Sunday), 404 new cases, 110 deaths; Paris (Monday), thirty-four new cases, twenty-two deaths; Havre (Sunday), thirteen new cases, eight deaths; Russia (Friday), 5,654 new cases, 2,610 deaths; there were several cases in Holland.

Domestic.—The President has abandoned his tour in northern and central New-York, owing to the condition of Mrs. Harrison's health. The State election was held in Maine; the plurality of Cleaves (Rep.) for Governor is estimated at 12,000.

City and Suburban.—A mob at Fire Island prevented the landing of the Normanna's passengers from the Cepheus, and they remained on board last night; Judge Barnard granted an injunction restraining the captain of the Cepheus, Governor Flower and Health Officer Jenkins from landing the people; Governor Flower issued a proclamation commanding the Sheriff of Suffolk County to preserve the peace; no new cases of cholera developed on the fleet at Lower Quarantine and no deaths occurred.
