

HAMILTON'S WEIGHT SHORT.

GLENMOYNE WON THE MATCH RACE, BUT WAS DISQUALIFIED.

MANY ANGRY BETTORS AT JEROME PARK WHO HAD PUT THEIR MONEY ON STONENELL AND HAD EITHER LEFT THE TRACK OR TURN UP THEIR TICKETS—THE JOCKEY FINED AND HIS 'VALET' RULED OFF—THE ENCUSERS MADE—E. TRIBE'S RIDING CLOSELY WATCHED.

"Stoneness wins, Glenmoynne is disqualified," was the cry that started the crowd at Jerome Park yesterday after the last race had been run.

Two trains packed with racegoers who were satisfied that Glenmoynne had won left the track. When it was announced that Glenmoynne was disqualified for being short of weight there was a general howl from the crowd.

Many of the persons who had bet on Stoneness left their tickets, and this caused them to howl louder, if anything, than the persons who lost their money on Glenmoynne.

The case is without a precedent in the history of racing in any country, so far as known, as the race was a match and there were only two jockeys to weigh for the race.

There were many numbers of reporters about the affair. One was that Hamilton, who rode Glenmoynne, made a mistake and weighed out with 107 pounds.

That report would not hold water, as the clerk of the scales would have noticed and called Hamilton's attention to it.

Everybody was mystified and a crowd gathered around the judges' stand wild with rage, as nearly everybody who had tickets on Glenmoynne wanted to get something out of the matter.
