AN HONOR TO TWO COUNTRIES.

SOMETHING ABOUT COLONEL ACHILLE DE VECCHI.

HIS WORK FOR THE REPUBLICAN PARTY AND HIS INFLUENCE AMONG ITALIAN-AMERICANS. "There do not appear to be many Italians like you in America," said the reporter. "No, indeed, nor, if I say it myself, not many in Italy either," he answered, while a blush came over his face. The speaker was Colonel Achille de Vecchi, of Washington, probably the best known and most representative Italian in this country and a member of the Italian Embassy in New-York City. He bears a striking resemblance to James Russell Lowell, in that he is tall and thin, weighs about 200 pounds, and is as erect as a soldier on parade, and just as elastic. He is a veteran of two wars and was wounded in two wars—at Solferino during the Austro-Italian campaign, and in the War of the Rebellion, when he commanded the 9th and 10th Massachusetts Artillery, known as the Vecchi's Battery. It was he who carried the letter from Garibaldi to President Lincoln offering the former's services to the Union cause, and the Colonel still preserves in his home his laurel wreath letters from the Martyr President and from Charles Sumner for his own patriotic service in the same line of duty.

The Colonel is a man of wealth, and has still a large amount of landed property in Italy. He is so intense a Republican that he visits many of the large cities at his own expense to win over Italian-American votes to the Republican cause. He is an eloquent speaker and knows well how to do this. Congressman Babcock, chairman of the Republican Congress Committee, speaks highly of the work that Colonel de Vecchi has done for the party, the most recent being in the Congress campaign in Illinois, where he has organized the Latin-Americans, the Bohemians and the Poles, and also did some effective work among the Germans. He speaks the language of all of these people. He met and dined with ex-President Harrison in Chicago recently, and says that the ex-President predicts a sweeping Republican majority for the next House of Representatives. A Tribune reporter had a brief conversation with Colonel de Vecchi yesterday, whom he found in company with his private secretary, Ernest Parrott, on the way to Rinecliff to visit Leopold Morton.

"How is the outlook in the West?" he was asked. "In all of the States through which I have been recently, notably Illinois, there are great gains for our party. But it would surprise you, the intense interest which is taken in the impending contest in the State of New-York. What about New-York is the question heard on all hands, and I think I have been justified in answering them, as I did over and over again, that the Empire State is going to roll up an overwhelming majority for our ex-Vice-President. How are you here in the city, though, I would like to know?" he asked, turning suddenly to the reporter. "Are you going to whip Tammany?" "Being assured that the outlook for this welcome result has never been so bright for twenty years, he smiled with satisfaction. "I believe it, firmly. I have left the quiet of my home and family in Washington to come among my own people in this city to urge them to help overthrow Hill and Tammany next November. And they are going to do it. I expect to enlist a majority of the Italian newspapers on the Republican side, and the Bohemian and the Slav papers, and the most influential of the Hebrew-American journals. Already the 'Cristoforo Colombo' and the 'New York Tribune' are the most influential papers here, and a warm advocate of Republican principles. What feeling do you find among your people here who have votes?" "A feeling of the most profound disgust, sir," Colonel de Vecchi replied, "at the present administration and the degradation and the starvation to which Democratic supremacy has reduced them and their fellow-citizens from other lands. Why, I have been through the Italian quarter downtown, and the thickly populated district known as 'Little Italy' uptown, and the people fairly swarmed through the streets after me in crowds. They were all really glad to see me, for they thought I was bringing them good news, and they were laughing and shouting. The big, genial face and the soldierly bearing of the Colonel would make any one feel better. He is 'solid' with the Latin-Americans, mainly because although a gentleman of taste and culture, he is still 'one of the boys,' and is just as ready to sup with them in a cheap restaurant in the Five Points as he is to dine at the Waldorf-Astoria in the National Capital, where he may be found any day. The Italian organization will give a dinner in his honor tomorrow afternoon, which will be both a campaign war in earnest by the raising of two large banners in the Italian quarter, and a social gathering of the heads of the Italian community in the neighborhood of Fourteenth-st. and Broadway."

RAILROAD INTERESTS.

WESTERN PASSENGER ASSOCIATION.

Chicago, Oct. 10.—The Western Passenger Association ended its session to-day. It was decided to allow mileage tickets to be signed in any office of a road belonging to the association, instead of in the office by which they are issued alone. This will be a great convenience to the users of such tickets. The holiday rate will probably be a fare and a third for the round trip on all roads members of the association. A proposition to make a Chicago rate to California of \$10 was defeated.

INVESTIGATING THE ATCHISON REBATES.

Chicago, Oct. 10.—The charge that large sums of money were paid during the last three years by the Santa Fe Railway in rebates to shippers in violation of the Interstate Commerce law was considered by the Federal Grand Jury to-day. Receiver A. P. Walker was summoned to appear and bring a lot of books and papers which it is believed will throw some light on the charge, but as he was in conference with his colleagues he was excused until to-morrow. The witnesses examined to-day were I. Thompson, a cattle-shipper from Kansas City, and an ex-employee of the Santa Fe from the same city named Taylor. The books of the company show that rebates were paid to Thompson, but the shipper refused to answer the telling questions, seeking refuge behind the recent decision of Judge Grosscup, that railroad officials and shippers need not answer questions which might incriminate themselves. Receiver Walker was ordered to produce to-morrow a receipt for \$5,000 signed by Samuel Lazarus, a Kansas City cattle-shipper. It is alleged the amount represents rebates on cattle shipments paid by the Santa Fe. The receipts of Jacob Dole and the American Live Stock Commission and other shippers of cattle were also ordered to be produced before the jury to-morrow. James P. Shields, of Dubuque, is acting as special counsel for the Interstate Commission.

A MEAN LANDLORD INDEED.

From The Pall Mall Gazette. A dock laborer named Jonathan Pinchbeck applied to Mr. Lane at North London Police Court to-day for assistance from the poor box.
